



## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As you heard in the last few weekends, this weekend is our Annual Catholic Appeal Commitment Weekend and this year's theme is "Come, follow me...and bring hope to the world."

I spoke about HOPE last weekend: how Jesus liberated the man possessed by an unclean spirit and offered him hope to live well again. We all know people in our lives who have brought hope to us and whom we have been a source of hope to.

Supporting the Annual Catholic Appeal is a concrete way for us to bring hope to those who might be benefited from it. It unites us as a faith community in demonstrating love of neighbor through the good works we are able to provide together. The Appeal drives the holy mission of our archdiocese to teach, to serve and to sanctify, allowing us to carry out the work of Christ.

Each of us is called to share his or her gifts in support of the Church. We must first support our parish and then our archdiocese and the Church throughout the world. The Annual Catholic Appeal of the Archdiocese of Chicago is a very effective way to support ministry outside of our parish boundaries, as well as to support the services that the archdiocese provides to our parish.

This year's appeal is slightly different because we are not collecting in-pew pledge forms. Rather, you will have the option to pick up a **mail-in giving envelope** located at the Church entrance table or from our greeters as you depart from church after Mass today. You can fill out your pledge later and mail it back directly.

We highly encourage you to consider making your gift online this year. It only takes a few simple steps and is secure. You can visit the website "[annualcatholicappeal.com](http://annualcatholicappeal.com)" to make your pledge online.

Another option that is new this year is a **text-to-give option**. Many of us have smartphones and this is a quick way to open up the secure giving form online to make a gift. If you would like, you may **text "ACA2021" to the number 345345**. You will then receive a response in your text messages. It would read something like "Thank you for your support! Please click the link to donate." The text-to-give form will allow for one-time or monthly/recurring giving.

## ONE HAVING AUTHORITY (2)

Recently in the media there have been reports on religious scandals: TV preachers and Catholic bishops and priests caught acting in immoral ways. The Gospel message that they had been preaching for years was true, and indeed many people were drawn closer to God. But then the scandal hit the papers. The message of those preachers was still true, but now it had lost much of its impact. Those who preached the Gospel were not true to their own words. As a result, in recent years, their credibility and the authority of the Church was terribly damaged.

This also can happen in the home. Parents have authority due to their position in the family. The 4th Commandment tells children to honor their mothers and fathers. But the authority of parents is lessened or even destroyed when parents act in ways that are not Christian. For example, all parents want their kids to be kind to each other. However, if their children observe Mom and Dad being mean to each other, they're going to learn meanness, not kindness, as the standard way of acting. So when these same parents tell their children that they should be kind to each other, the children respond as though their parents no longer have authority to tell them how to behave.

Jesus spoke with authority. He was not two-faced like the scribes and Pharisees. He was not hypocritical. He didn't have a dark side of his life that he kept hidden. He didn't just speak the truth, He was the Truth Incarnate. Jesus gave orders to unclean spirits, and they obeyed him. It wasn't the words that expelled demons, it was the person who spoke those words. Jesus has called us to be His presence for others. He calls us to speak for Him. But for us to exercise this authority, both our words must be true and we must live as committed Christians.

## HEALING IN THE PANDEMIC

If we watch the news on TV or listen to it on the radio, we hear of the hundreds each day who are ill and in the hospital with the covid virus. We hear of the people each day who die. News broadcasters tell us of the numbers in our city, state, and country who have died from the virus. Now we also hear of those who have died totally from all over the world. We live in a troubled time. Added to that are the many people who do not have adequate food or those who cannot pay their rent or housing note and may lose their homes. It is an overwhelming experience. If we face these situations personally, it is difficult beyond our understanding of what to do or where to get help. Our medical personnel bear the heavy burden of being present as people die. They face this each day without relief.

In the Gospel today, we are told the story of Jesus' ministry in the villages and towns in Galilee. He goes from synagogue to homes, healing people. We have developed medicines and vaccines which hopefully help us. We have treatments which enable us to recover if we have the strength to do so. In the time of Jesus that was not the case. Jesus became the source of healing. He was the amazing person who could help them be well. He healed their bodies and drove the evil spirits out of their beings. He gave them hope. They sought Him, following Him, seeking healing and freedom. They believed that He could and would heal them.

What about us today in the midst of all that is happening? People cannot make systems work. Seeking vaccines can be a frustrating task with such great numbers and great needs for medicine. Where can we go? The compassion of others, the support of people who care and share what they have, helps those in need. In the end, we have to do what the people in the Gospel did. We have to seek Jesus. He will give us the strength to endure. He will heal us. He will show us the way. He always cares for us even when we do not feel his care. We have to believe and reach out. When we can, we have to try to be Jesus for others. We have God dwelling in us. We can be kind, loving, patient, caring, generous and open to those in need, in pain, in the midst of struggle. God will give us the strength to be the hands of Jesus, the voice of Jesus, the compassion of Jesus today. Go to Jesus. He will help us and act through us. "Nothing is impossible to God"






