

## United Center Vaccination Site Is Open

The United Center mass vaccination site is currently open and the focus is on vaccinating those 65 and older who live in the City of Chicago. Getting seniors vaccinated is critical for preventing severe outcomes and protecting our healthcare system.

Although appointments are limited, they have also been opened to Chicago residents 18-64 with underlying conditions living in vulnerable, under-vaccinated zip codes. There is ongoing focused outreach to people living in these zip codes with specific signup methods. People who live in these zip codes can also call the call center for assistance. You must live in one of the targeted zip codes in order to register - 60608, 60609, 60619, 60620, 60621, 60623, 60624, 60628, 60629, 60632, 60636, 60639, 60644, 60649, 60651, 60652, 60653 - otherwise your appointment will be cancelled. To reach the United Center Help Desk, call 312-746-4835. However, be prepared to call several times. From those I have spoken to, the best time to call is in the late afternoon. The hours for the Help Desk are as follows: Monday-Saturday: 8:00 am to 8:00 pm; Sunday: 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Drive-through and walk-up options are available. Language assistance is provided, and the United Center is accessible to people with disabilities.

## Cardinal Cupich's Message Regarding the Vaccine

Cardinal Cupich shared a message and resources from the Vatican's Dicastery for Human Development with the presbyterate regarding the COVID-19 vaccine. To highlight a few key headlines:

- o Catholics can receive whatever vaccine is offered to them – Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson – with a clear conscience.
- o We should be encouraged to take seriously our moral responsibility to be vaccinated in view of the connection between our personal health and the public health.
- o We should not fail to advocate for universal accessibility of vaccines as an important ethical issue.



## ENCOUNTERING THE RISEN LORD ANEW

Leading up to this Easter were two hopeful things we at St. Mother Teresa Parish have witnessed, namely the availability of the vaccines and the anticipation of our RCIA elect and candidates for Easter Vigil Sacraments. We all remember how our lives were abruptly interrupted in March 2020. As we were getting ready for Easter, our Churches had to be closed and we were ordered to stay at home. We had to quickly adjust our worship to online and TV. We still remember how we missed our in-person celebrations. It has been a long year of physical isolations and social distancing and constant use of hand sanitizers. This Easter, we know how blessed we are to be able to celebrate the most solemn liturgies of the life of our Church in person. With the relaxed restrictions on COVID from CDC, the Archdiocese has just informed us that our parishes in the Archdiocese are allowed to plan for the resumption of some liturgical and parish practices, which include resuming altar serving, physical collections, and bringing up the gifts.

Our parish Liturgy Committee will meet on Monday April 5<sup>th</sup> to map out a plan to resume these practices orderly and systematically. One of the things we all have to reflect on is how can we help our parishioners to safely return to in-person mass and how can we help our ministers to feel safe in order to return to their services? I will keep you posted on our parish's plan for resuming these parish liturgical practices. Meanwhile, please feel free to invite your families and friends who have been vaccinated and are in good health to join us for in-person mass.

After 8 months of intense preparation with classes and rituals, our RCIA people had their Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion at the Easter Vigil. We congratulate them and rejoice with them. Their conversion reminds us that God continues to call each one of us to carry on Jesus' mission. **How is God calling you this Easter? What if God is calling you to something greater and more life-giving? Indeed, God wants us to encounter the Risen Lord anew this Easter.** In the midst of our challenges, we carry on our daily cross and journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and to His empty tomb and resurrection. Are we ready to respond with a *yes*?

Happy Easter to all! May the risen Lord fill your hearts and minds with abundant joy, peace and love.

## EASTER By Sister Caritas

A number of years ago, I had the opportunity to make an eight-day retreat in the retreat house in the Arizona Desert between Tucson and Phoenix. The setting was the desert amid distant mountains and unique cactus. At night you could hear the coyotes. It was eight days of silence. One of the things I enjoyed previously when I lived in the desert was the magnificent sunsets. I asked God for one of the beautiful sunsets. The eight days there, I never saw the usual kind of sunsets I remembered. Each morning, however, I saw a beautiful morning sunrise. Each one was different and beautiful. Each morning it was like an amazing surprise, a gift from God.

Some of the darkest times in my life have been the deaths of people I have loved. During those times, life seemed very difficult, very dark, very hard. With prayer, effort and the support of friends, I made it through those times to, as it were, a morning sunrise. Gradually, sometimes years later, the sunshine of God's love would be again in my life. I was and am grateful for God's faithfulness. The support of family and friends brought the brightness of a new day.

We have been walking through the dark times in the life of Jesus. Today we celebrate the "sunrise", the Resurrection of Jesus. We celebrate that He is risen. He is alive. He will never die again. In His Risen life, He brings us salvation and new life. Through Easter Grace, we again walk in the light of Risen Jesus. It seems impossible, but we know and believe Jesus is alive and alive in us. We rejoice, we celebrate. We say Alleluia. Each day, with the grace of God, we live the new life of Jesus.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults** is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith.

**Weddings:** Weddings need to be scheduled at least six months in advance. Couples are reminded to secure the Church date before the reception hall.
