


The United Center mass vaccination site is currently open. Beginning April 19th, all adults 18 and over will be eligible to receive the vaccine.



Drive-through and walk-up options are available. Language assistance is provided, and the United Center is accessible to people with disabilities.

Cardinal Cupich's Message Regarding the Vaccine

Cardinal Cupich shared a message and resources from the Vatican's Dicastery for Human Development with the presbyterate regarding the COVID-19 vaccine. To highlight a few key headlines:

- o Catholics can receive whatever vaccine is offered to them – Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson – with a clear conscience.
- o We should be encouraged to take seriously our moral responsibility to be vaccinated in view of the connection between our personal health and the public health.
- o We should not fail to advocate for universal accessibility of vaccines as an important ethical issue.

THOMAS AND THE DIVINE MERCY

Every second Sunday of Easter, whether A, B, or C year, one Apostle gets special mention in the Gospels: the Apostle Thomas. He's a rather interesting individual, but we know only a little about him except for a few brief mentions in the Gospels. Unfortunately, somewhere along the line, he has picked up the reputation as a skeptic, or as a "doubting Thomas". But I wonder if Thomas really deserves the bad rap that he's been given. Perhaps he was simply a practical, forthright, no-nonsense individual who just said what he felt, similar to Nathaniel, another Apostle whom Jesus had commended for his "lack of guile."

For example, at the Last Supper, when Jesus reveals to the Apostles that he's going away but that they will follow him later, it's Thomas who asks the obvious: "Lord, we don't know where you are going; how can we know the way?" seemingly asking for a roadmap. Another time, when the Apostles are fearful of returning to Jerusalem when Jesus asks them to, it's Thomas who says, "Let us go to Jerusalem, so that we can die with him." Does this sound like a doubter, someone who is trying to shirk his duty? Hardly. And today when Thomas is absent when Christ appears to the others on that first Easter evening, some Bible scholars suggest that it was not because Thomas had chickened out or deserted, but rather because, after hearing Mary Magdalene's announcement of Jesus's resurrection that morning, he impetuously went out in search of Jesus. Does this sound like Thomas was a coward or a doubter?

We may never know why Thomas was absent that first Easter Sunday, but one thing is sure: Thomas was having a very bad week. First of all, he had missed Jesus' first appearance that the others had insisted had happened. Secondly, he was unwilling to believe their testimony, so much so that he blurted out his demand for proof by touching Jesus' wounds before he would believe. Thus when Jesus does appear a week later, Thomas, after his initial rejoicing, must have felt totally guilty at his lack of faith, almost like another Judas. But rather than condemn or reject him, Christ gives him his personal attention and invites him to touch his hands and his side as he'd demanded to do. We don't know if Thomas ever did touch the wounds, but it's at that moment that he personally experienced the divine mercy, conscious that God had forgiven his slowness to believe the testimony of his brother Apostles.

That's why it's appropriate to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday on the same day we celebrate the Thomas story. Thomas was the first Apostle to directly experience God's mercy to him in a personal way, and the first to openly proclaim, "My Lord and my God!" True, Simon Peter had previously acknowledged Jesus "the Messiah, the Son of the Living God," but his notion of the Messiah at that time was not quite correct since he was imagining a political messiah. Thomas recognized Jesus as his Lord and God, and not just the Son of God, but God himself, because he had experienced the Divine Mercy personally. That's why the Thomas story fits in perfectly for Divine Mercy Sunday.

EASTER FAITH By Sister Caritas

Have you ever experienced this? You miss a family gathering and someone you wanted to see for a long-time was there and you did not go. Did you miss a meeting of a committee or group and a decision was made? You were not a part of it because you were not there. You felt left out.

Today we have an Easter story. Jesus appears to the Apostles and Thomas was not there. All the other apostles saw Jesus alive and Thomas missed out. Thomas could not and would not believe that Jesus was alive. He was still sad. The others were joyful. He was on the outside of the experience. Who had ever seen someone dead being alive? Do you experience joy as you live faith knowing Jesus is alive? Pray for the deepening grace of faith to touch you in a new way. Can you see the Risen life of Jesus in your experiences? Can you respond like Thomas, "My Lord and My God"? God will give the graces you ask for. Thomas is an Easter model. Jesus will lead us from doubt to deep faith. Be open! Jesus is Alive!


