





United Center Vaccination Site Is Open

The United Center mass vaccination site is currently open. Beginning April 19th, all adults 18 and over will be eligible to receive the vaccine. Also on that date, the United Center will switch to the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. If you have received your first Pfizer shot and are scheduled for the second shot after April 19th, you will need to go through the drive-up vaccination site.

To reach the United Center Help Desk, call 312-746-4835. However, be prepared to call several times. From those I have spoken to, the best time to call is in the late afternoon. The hours for the Help Desk are as follows: Monday-Saturday: 8:00 am to 8:00 pm; Sunday: 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Drive-through and walk-up options are available. Language assistance is provided, and the United Center is accessible to people with disabilities. Hint: if they ask if you need a wheelchair, accept one. You will be taken to a certain area where the vaccine will be given immediately, rather than waiting in line.

Cardinal Cupich's Message Regarding the Vaccine

Cardinal Cupich shared a message and resources from the Vatican's Dicastery for Human Development with the presbyterate regarding the COVID-19 vaccine. To highlight a few key headlines:

- o Catholics can receive whatever vaccine is offered to them – Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson – with a clear conscience.
- o We should be encouraged to take seriously our moral responsibility to be vaccinated in view of the connection between our personal health and the public health.
- o We should not fail to advocate for universal accessibility of vaccines as an important ethical issue.

Re-igniting our Faith through the Eucharist and Liturgical Ministry

The pandemic has unprecedentedly disrupted our liturgical celebrations and ministries. It continues to challenge us to be prudent and hopeful. With the slowdown of the COVID spread and the vaccinations, we have seen some of our sisters and brothers returned to in-person mass with our community and we expect more parishioners and friends who will gradually and safely come back to our communal celebrations. This calls our parish to be proactively prepared. Our Liturgy Committee met last week to discuss our plan for safely re-engaging our parishioners and ministers. We hope some of our liturgical practices, such as ushers, altar servers, and gift bearers, will resume on Pentecost.

Based on our discussions, I now invite you to:

1. Reserve the date for a zoom talk by our very own **Fr. Brad Zamora** on Wed., May 5th from 7pm to 8:15pm, titled: **Re-ignite our Faith through Eucharist and Liturgical Ministry. More information will be available next weekend.**
2. If you are our "inactive ministers" who are ready to be active again or if you are our current ministers during the pandemic, you will receive communications from your ministry heads regarding our parish's "action plan" for reengagement.
3. If you feel that God is calling you to be a new minister in our parish, please call me, email me or talk to me after mass, and our parish wants your participation. Good news...two of our brothers and sisters have already said YES!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

“WHY ARE YOU TROUBLED?”

We have been rejoicing and celebrating the mystery of the Lord’s resurrection in the last two weeks. On Easter Sunday, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb in the early morning and saw the stone was removed from the tomb and the other disciples saw the empty tomb and believed. The disciples were troubled because their Master died and they didn’t understand Jesus’ promise of resurrection and the meaning of resurrection.

Pope Francis wrote that “Since Christ is resurrected, we can look with new eyes and a new heart at every event of our lives, even the most negative ones. Moments of darkness, of failure and even sin can be transformed and announce the beginning of a new path. When we have reached the lowest point of our misery and our weakness, the Risen Christ gives us the strength to rise again. If we entrust ourselves to him, his grace saves us! The Lord, Crucified and Risen, is the full revelation of mercy, present and working throughout history.”

On the second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, we heard how the disciples were afraid and locked themselves behind the doors and the Risen Lord came and shared with them a message of peace and forgiveness. Thomas was invited to touch the divine wounds and his faith was restored and we all are told that “blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.”

Pope Francis wrote that “We need to overcome the fear of joy; we need to think of the many times that we are not joyful because we are afraid. In my homeland there is a saying that goes like this: when someone gets burned by boiling milk, he cries when he sees the cow. The disciples, who were burned by the drama of the cross, said: ‘No, let’s stop here! He is in heaven, that’s excellent, he is risen, but may he not come back again because we can’t handle it!’”

St. Faustina urges us to trust in Jesus for his most precious blood has paid the price for our salvation. She prays that “O Jesus! I desire to bring all sinners to your feet that they may glory in your mercy throughout endless ages.” Divine Mercy can help us to rejoice and trust!

On this third Sunday, the Risen Lord appeared to the two troubled disciples and asked them, “Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts?”

Jesus said to Sr. Mary of the Holy Trinity, “The future is mine, what do your fear? I have given you my Mother to enlighten your way. Look at her, the Morning Star.”

What troubles us today? The Risen Lord invites us to experience the empty tomb, to touch his healed wounds, and to know him in the breaking of the bread. Why don’t we allow Him to fill us with Easter peace, joy, and life. The Risen Lord is our present and future.

THE DIVINE MERCY REVISITED

Each Divine Mercy Sunday we should thank Saint Pope John Paul II for reminding us of God's love for all people—no matter their station, no matter their sins.

Divine Mercy Sunday is a celebration established by our beloved Pope in 2000. On the Sunday after Easter that year he canonized Blessed Faustina Kowalska, a devoted religious, designating the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. Mindful of St. Faustina's gift to the Church at Easter, our Holy Father proclaimed:

"Jesus said to St. Faustina one day, 'Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy! Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity.'

What our Holy Father is saying is that personal transformation—the passage into new life that we celebrated at Easter—is only possible because of God's mercy. Each time we witness to mercy, we transform ourselves in God's image and offer the gift of new life to the world. We become creators in a worldly way and in a spiritual way, too.

God's mercy opens the door to a deeper practice of our faith, never failing to forgive and transform. So, think of mercy as your starting point. Know that mercy is God's personal gift to you. Then share the bounty. Reach out to all of Creation, to everyone you encounter, and offer them the example of transformation that God has called you to be. Mercy is a chance to heal divisions, overcome the hurts, set aside the misunderstandings, and start over. With God's blessing.

Let us accept God's divine mercy as the gift that never stops giving back. The more we practice being merciful, the more complete we become, and the stronger we are for the journey home. Think big, practice small, like St. Mother Teresa did; do an act of mercy a day. More when we can. We can be assured of God's reward and blessing.

WITNESSING LIVES

Some people whom I know watch "Judge Judy" on TV. Some people watch her every day she is on. I am not one of those people. She seems to have a clear judgement about cases. When you watch the two people involved in the case tell their side of the story, in a sense, these people are witnessing to what the problem or crime is. Police are always looking for truthful witnesses to tell about the crime or crimes committed. Witnesses are important. As young children, brothers and sisters "tell" their side of the story to their parents. We may call it tattling. Parents try to sort out what really happened.

Today's Gospel has Jesus describing to the Apostles that what happened to Him was written in the scriptures. He was telling them and "opened their minds to the scriptures". As they later taught others, they would understand God's perspective given in the scriptures. He told them, "You are witnesses to all that happened". They were to be bearers of the truth and tell the story of His suffering, death, and resurrection. They had to be people of integrity and live the truth as well as speak it.

Witnesses must tell the facts as the truth they saw and know. At Mass we hear homilies. Some priests are very good at sharing the faith. Some are eloquent. Others are simple preachers but their message is powerful because it is not just words; they live the words in their lives. They are witnesses. What they preach rings true in their lives and the truth "rings out" because their words and actions are compatible with their preaching. They are people who inspire and whom we believe. They are witnesses.

We, as Catholic Christians, bear the responsibility to be witnesses. We are to speak the truth about Jesus' words and teachings. More importantly, we need to have our words and way of life match. We are called, as St. Francis of Assisi put it: "Go out into the world and preach the Gospel and, if necessary, speak." If our actions witness to Jesus, you will not need to speak. Your life and actions will speak and witness. Be witnesses to Jesus. Go into the whole world, your daily world, and witness.


