## LIFEGIVING COMMANDMENTS By Sister Caritas

If we look at our family life, we may remember things that our parents told us that were considered commandments. They were permanent things we had to do when we lived at home. One of those commandments for my brother and I was, “don’t come home without the other one.” Throughout grade school we daily went to school, together. We went to the store for my Mother, together. We went to the ballgame on Ladies’ Day or to a movie, together. We always came home together. If he was not around at home, I wanted to know where he was, or he wanted to know where I was. It was part of the very close relationship we developed over the years. This close relationship existed even until he died.

‘These are the formative commandments Jesus gives us. They are life giving and life lasting commandments. He wanted the commandment in today’s Gospel to be one of the guiding rules of our entire lives. “Love one another, as I have loved you.” Throughout His public life, Jesus talks about His love for His Father and His Father’s love for Him. This was to be our example of how to love each other. Living this command of love can be a source of joy the way we bear fruit and give glory to God the Father.

How do we love one another? Jesus calls us to a life of care and kindness based on generous love. This is not a love for “what I can get in return.” It is the kind of love that is willing to sacrifice, “to lay down one’s life for the other.” In living out what Jesus tells us, we become those specially chosen by Jesus to be His followers. We will be loved by the Father and Jesus if we keep this commandment. “Love one another.”

## KEEPING CHRIST'S COMMANDMENTS

*"If you love me, you will keep my commandments"*

A question we should ask ourselves: Do I truly love Christ or am I simply deluding myself and others by saying so to get something out of Him or to avoid His wrath?

There's a story of a man who dreamt he was walking down a street and met an angel carrying a flaming torch in one hand and a bucket of water in the other. The man asked the angel, "Where are you going with that torch and that bucket of water?" The angel stopped, looked at the man and said, "With this torch I'm going to burn down all the mansions of heaven" (Christ said there were many mansions in his Father's House). "And with this bucket of water I'm going to go down and put out all the fires of hell; and then we will see who really loves God."

The point of the story is that many of us obey God's commandments not out of love of God but because of fear of punishment in hell or hope of reward in heaven. Thus we obey the commandments for reasons other than what Jesus asks for, out of love for him: "If you love me you will keep my commandments."

Here's another story to show the link between love and the commandments:

One day Francis of Assisi met an old soldier buddy of his who claimed he dearly loved God but admitted that he rarely kept the commandments. He all too often gave into temptation and didn't avoid occasions of sin as he should. But he was adamant that he loved God deeply. When Francis challenged his reasoning, the man admitted that he feared losing heaven and going to hell, but he believed God would still forgive his admittedly loose lifestyle, because he insisted his love for God was genuine.

As they walked along they met a beggar who was both blind and crippled. Francis said to the blind beggar, "Tell me, my son, what would you do if I were to restore your sight and the use of your limbs? Would you love me?"

"Sir," said the beggar, "I would not only love you, but I would be your slave and obey your every command for the rest of my life."

"You see," said Francis to his friend who insisted his love for God was genuine, "this man would love me and serve me if I gave him his sight and his health; then why can't you obey God who created you with two good eyes and strong limbs?"

God asks the same question of each of us: Why don't you love me who gave you health and other blessings, food, shelter, clothing, education and friends?

We must say to God what that beggar said to St. Francis, "I'll not only love you, I'll serve you and obey your every command for the rest of my life."

This is what Christ says in today's Gospel: if you love me you will do what I want; and what he wants is made clear in his commandments.

So that's the decision we must make to show we truly love Him. Still, the saints tell us that perfect obedience of the commandments would be virtually impossible for us unless of course we got some outside help—namely the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost Jesus will send the Holy Spirit upon his Church as he did last week upon our Confirmation kids, to help us keep his commandments and grow in his love.
