



Often in life, we find that people we really care about live far away from us. Sometimes family members move to a distant state or city. Sometimes they come to visit or we go to visit them. When we find an answer to something which helps us to grow in goodness and kindness, that is the Spirit of God, with us. The Sequence prayer gives us more images and deeper understanding of the Holy Spirit. Like the Apostles, we need the help of the Holy Spirit. As they did, we need to pray for the help and activation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Come Holy Spirit. Come Father of the poor. Come melt our hardened hearts. Come Holy Spirit and act in our Church and act through us. Come Holy Spirit!

COME, HOLY SPIRIT

Here's a humorous story for Pentecost: One bright Sunday morning, Benson's mother hurries into her son's bedroom to wake him up. "Benson, it's Sunday, time to get up and go to church! Get up, sleepyhead!"

Benson mumbles from under the covers, "I don't want to go." "What do you mean you don't want to go?" says his mother. "That's silly. Now get up and get dressed and go to church!" Benson says, "No, I don't want to go and I'll give you two reasons why I don't want to go." He props himself up in bed and continues, "First, I don't like them, and second, they don't like me."

His mother replies, "Now, Benson, that's just plain nonsense. That's silly. You've got to get up and go to church and I'll give you two reasons why you must. First, you're forty years old now, and secondly, you're the pastor!"

Sleepyhead Benson could very well be like any of the Apostles in today's Gospel whom Jesus had commissioned to be His witnesses in Jerusalem, in Judea, in Samaria and to the ends of the earth. But as soon as He leaves them, what happens? They retire to the upper room and "hide for fear of the Jews." Like Benson, the Apostles knew that the people didn't like them, that their message was different from the popular message of the time, so they just wanted to roll back over in bed, and not have to go out and face the hostile crowd.

Sometimes we Catholics are a lot like that. We go to church quietly, receive Jesus in our hearts quietly, and go home again quietly to say our morning and evening prayers quietly. But what about the command Jesus gave us last week to be His witnesses and share the Good News of God's love with all mankind? And the gifts of the Holy Spirit He gives us today to do so?

Yes, people often don't want to hear about God. We're afraid they are going to turn us off if we speak to them about faith, or not listen to us, or call us religious freaks. "They don't like us and we don't like them." And so, like Benson, we give up on our God-given mission to be His witnesses and go back to bed and curl back up into our nice comfort zone.

Fortunately, Pastor Benson has a guide, his mother, who wakes him and coaxes him to go out and do his duty. This is the kind of work that the Holy Spirit does in the hearts of believers. When fear of trouble tends to paralyze us into silent submission, afraid to speak out, the Holy Spirit is the adrenalin of the Mystical Body of Christ that warms us up and empowers us to go out there and make a difference. He (or She) reminds us, as Benson's mother reminded him, that we have a mission, to tell our friends and relatives the Good News of God's love and that they are invited to the RCIA to learn more about Him. So let us pray: "Come, Holy Spirit."

Communion Calls: Please contact the Rectory when someone who is homebound or in the hospital wishes a visit to receive Holy Communion or the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The Anointing of the Sick is for anyone seriously sick and not only for those near death.

Ministry of Care: Eucharistic Ministers are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass. Notify the Parish Office when this service is needed.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith.

Weddings: Weddings need to be scheduled at least six months in advance. Couples are reminded to secure the Church date before the reception hall.


