Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is the best time you will spend on earth.


If you are looking for vocations, as a community have adoration every day. Once the Missionaries of Charity started daily adoration, their vocations doubled.

REVERENCE TOWARD THE EUCHARIST by Fr. Cuff

We Catholics who receive the Sacred Host each Sunday should ask ourselves, do we really believe that we are being changed into the Body of Christ at that moment? Then why don't we experience more of this radical transformation in our own selves? Perhaps a story might help:

A team of Russians and Americans were on a common expedition on an icebreaker ship in the Antarctic. Among their cabin foodstuff was Russian black bread, tasty but hard on the teeth. It happened during a meal that an American bit into a piece and snapped a tooth. He threw the bread overboard and growled: "Lousy communist bread!" One of the Russians countered: "Is not lousy communist bread! Is rotten capitalist teeth!" Fortunately, tempers soon calmed down. The point of the story is that if we don't experience the transforming power of the Eucharist in our lives, it's certainly not the fault of the Eucharist, but maybe because of our rotten faith. If we could approach the Eucharist with a livelier faith in the Real Presence, we'd surely experience therein God's saving power and transforming love in our lives.

Those 5000 Jews whom Jesus feeds in today's Gospel in the miracle of the five loaves and two fish later asked for more bread. Jesus promised to give them the sacramental food of his Body and Blood instead. But of course not understanding, they mutter among themselves saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" When Jesus reaffirms that "My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink," they end up distancing themselves from the Eucharist because sacramental language makes no sense to people in a materialistic that in common no matter how different the culture. frame of mind. The same problem these early would-be followers of Jesus had is still with us today. A recent statistic says that about 40% of Catholics, like those disbelieving Jews who walked out on Christ that day, no longer believe in the Real Presence. Many in our secular age approach the Eucharist with a materialistic mentality; they too fail to understand and thus lose the benefits of this great gift of God's love. While the Eucharist is true food and drink, yet at the same time it is very different from every other food and drink. As Christ told St. Augustine at prayer: "You will not change me into yourself as you would food of your flesh; but you will be changed into me." We transform ordinary food into our own bodies, but the food of the Eucharist transforms us into the Body of Christ. "You are what you eat" is never truer than when we receive the Eucharist.

Today's Feast helps us better understand and venerate gift.

the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, since it is a Sacrament of life which, if misused, could bring about the opposite effect. As St Paul goes on in the first reading today in his letter to the Corinthians, "All who eat and drink in an unworthy manner, without discerning the Lord's body, eat and drink judgment against themselves. For this reason, many of you are weak and ill, and some have died." With that in mind, today is also a good day to mention the careless way some people at Mass receive Communion, such as thoughtlessly handling the Sacred Host without even giving a cursory glance at what they are receiving. There's also the problem of people coming up the aisle half-dressed to receive the Holy Eucharist, in shorts or plunging necklines, causing scandal to others, to say nothing of the insult to our Blessed Lord. What St. Paul seems to imply here is that if people are not going to receive more reverently and dress more modestly, perhaps they should skip Mass altogether. It would probably be better for them to commit the sin of missing Mass than to commit sacrilege against Christ's sacred Body and Blood, or to quote St. Paul, to "eat and drink judgment against themselves." Today let us examine how we revere the Blessed Sacrament.

Bread of Life by Sister Caritas

One of the best smells to me is the smell of homemade braked bread when you come in your home. My mother made homemade bread. I would come home after school and I knew by the smell of the house, my mother had made homemade bread. It also meant I might get a slice of the crust. Very tasty. One year when I was preparing second graders for first communion, my mother was generous enough to come and teach my children how to bake bread. When my other died about six years later, a few of the then eighth graders told me they remembered my Mom from the day of baking bread. Bread is a basic part of most cultures. Different cultures have different kinds of bread. We share

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The gospel today tells of Jesus feeding five thousand people with only five loaves and two fish. Everyone ate and had enough. Twelve baskets were filled with the leftovers. In the Gospel of the Last Supper, Jesus takes bread, blesses it and gives it to His disciples saying, "Take this and eat, this is my body which will be given for you". Later they are told, "Do this to remember me."

In our celebration of Mass, we fulfill this request of Jesus. We believe the bread and wine, blest by the priest at Mass, is the body and blood of Jesus. We are given this gift. We believe with our deep faith, this mystery, we too can be satisfied and nourished. This Eucharistic gift enables us to serve the people of God. We give thanks for this wonderful
