
#### THE TWO SONS by Fr. John Cuff

An old woman lay dying in a hospital. She'd led a full life. Her husband had died after ten years of marriage and left her with six children. Her children all lived near to the hospital where she was dying. The family appeared to be close, except for one daughter, the black sheep of the family. This daughter was never present at most family gatherings. Furthermore, she married a man whom no one liked. Her brothers and sisters warned her he was trouble, and they were correct; the marriage ended in divorce. But instead of returning to her family, she continued to stay away. Time went on and the mother of the family was nearing her last days. As she lay dying in the hospital, her children paid fewer and fewer visits. It was too depressing for them to handle. Mom had been the matriarch, the strength, the glue of the family. Now she was dwindling away to nothing and her children just couldn't deal with it. With one exception, however: the daughter who was the so-called black sheep; she stayed with her mother for hours each day, feeding her and taking care of her. At the funeral the other children spoke about what a great family they'd had, thanks to their mother. But it was the daughter who had been absent at many birthdays and holidays who did the will of the Heavenly Father and put true family life into practice

Today's Gospel is about two sons who say one thing and do another. Asked by the father to go and work in the vineyard, the first son said no but later reconsidered and did the work. The second son, on the other hand, courteously said yes to his father, but failed to do the work. Who actually did what his father wanted? Clearly the first son, the one who had earlier said no to him. Jesus' parable likens the tax collectors and prostitutes to that son who first said no but later did what the father wanted, and the Pharisees and scribes to the son who enthusiastically said yes but did not go. The first group had no fine words, but they had good deeds. The other group had fine words but no corresponding good deeds. Both represent two kinds of people and their different ways of relating to God. There are those who have no fine words: like those who profess no faith, who may not go to church, who do not pray. But when they see injustice, they'll be the first to rise up and condemn it. For example, when there are people out in the cold, they'll be the first to donate a blanket. Though they may have few fine words to say to God or about God, when they do things such as these, they're doing what God has commanded us all to do. In any event, we Catholics should aim to be men and women who profess our faith both in word and in deed, knowing that "Not all those who say to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but those who do the will of my Father who is in heaven."

#### St. Barbara HVAC PROJECT - UPDATE:

As everyone can see, the St. Barbara Church HVAC system has been completed and is running. The total cost of the project was \$329,781 and includes additional costs paid to Peoples Gas and for the fence/barrier. As of today, we have collected \$59,000 from our generous donors in the parish campaign. With a \$100,000 from "To Teach Who Christ Is" (TTWCI) and \$100,000 in matching donations we are \$50,000 short from the original goal, plus another \$20,000 to full project costs. Please note that to finish the project we got a loan from the Archdiocese. The loan balance to be paid as of today is \$34,443. *You can still donate! You can still help! You can still earn your donor plaque!* 

Now that the system is complete and working you can be sure that your donation is put to good use. If you still have not made your donation, please do so soon. If you can donate more, please help us. You can write a check, give online, or bring cash. *We will accept additional donations for St. Barbara Church HVAC until October 15, 2023*. 


