WHAT I LEARNED IN EVANGELIZATION SCHOOL by Roberta Cheong

In Pope Paul VI's *EVANGELII NUNTIANDI*, he wrote that the Catholic Church exists in order to evangelize. From the moment of our Baptism, evangelization is the lifelong mission God gave to us. To evangelize is to lead someone to personally encounter and follow Jesus Christ for themselves by proclaiming the Gospel to them—or to help let Jesus encounter them. The goal is for them to have a personal, intimate relationship with Jesus too.

In 2020, I decided I wanted to become better at evangelizing for the sake of building the Kingdom of God. So I studied at the St. Paul School of Evangelization, earning a Certificate of Evangelization in May 2021.

When we graduated, we received a t-shirt with the words "What's your story?" printed on it in big bold letters. It's definitely a quick way to invite strangers everywhere we go to initiate conversations with us and tell us their life story!

Since all of us Catholics are called to evangelize others, I wish to share with you some practical ways to "make disciples" that I learned in evangelization school. The main lesson I learned was a general model to use when we evangelize. We begin the faith conversation with a starter question, such as "What's your story?" Or "What has your journey to God been like?" Or "How would you describe your relationship with

God?" The model is: Ask—Listen—Befriend—Proclaim the Gospel—Invite.

Superseding above all is the Holy Spirit. We should always let the Holy Spirit be our primary guide. Sometimes the Holy Spirit will inspire us to ask a question or to say something unique to that person's heart that will instantly move them toward Christ.

If you met someone in an elevator and you wanted to explain the Gospel of Jesus Christ to them in 3 minutes, assuming they've never heard it before, how would you say it? Prepare and practice how to articulate it in advance.

Inviting can be done in a variety of ways and should be done consistently (Don't give up if they say no the first few times.):

- Personally inviting them to the Alpha or Go Deeper sessions that our parish offers

- Personally inviting them to sign up for our parish's OCIA or Parish Religious Education Program

- Introducing them to our parish priest and/or religious sisters, and inviting them to have a one-on-one discussion on the Catholic faith, especially if they have

many theological questions

- Personally inviting them to our church's BBQs, picnics, parties, movie nights, game nights, Summer Fair, church tours, pilgrimages, Holy Hour, Bible sharings, rosary prayer sessions, Lectio Divina, Stations of the Cross, presentations or talks, or other events

- If they live far away, you can give them a list of Catholic Churches near them that they can get involved with.

- You can send them FORMÉD videos (produced by the Augustine Institute) that educate people on the Catholic faith and invite them to watch it.

- Personally inviting them to attend a sacramental ceremony (i.e. your wedding, your child's Baptism or Confirmation, your grandmother receiving the Anointing of the Sick, etc.)

Another useful tool to have is to prepare in advance our personal "**One Good Reason**" for various topics. So if we are talking to someone about Confession, we can say, "Can I give you one good reason why I personally go to Confession?" Or "Can I share with you one good reason why I choose to be Catholic (or why I go to Mass, read the Bible, pray the rosary, believe in God, love this parish, etc.)?"

Here are more starter questions I thought of. We can ask these questions to gauge where someone is in their discipleship journey: I'd love to hear your story. Are you open to talking about God? Do you have a personal relationship with God? What is it like? How would you describe your relationship with Jesus? How would you describe your spiritual life? Would you be open to discussing your faith? What religion do you consider yourself? I'd love to hear about your faith and beliefs. Would you be willing to talk more about that? Would you be willing to share with me how you came to believe in God (or how you got to where you are spiritually)? What is your prayer life like? Do you go to church on Sundays? (If yes), where? Are you Catholic? Are you baptized? Have you ever considered becoming Catholic? Did you know that Jesus Christ Himself founded the Catholic Church? Do you believe that Jesus is God? Do you believe in the Holy Trinity? If you died today, where do you think you would go?

What Jesus is calling us to do is to make disciples for Him. It's not enough that someone simply believes that Jesus is God and saved us from our sins. Jesus wants everyone to follow Him and be His disciple. This is more than just being a believer in Christ. It is a total surrendering of oneself to Him and a reordering of one's life according to the will of God—to belong to and to live for Christ. To be **in Christ** and Christ in them.

St. Barbara HVAC PROJECT - UPDATE:

As everyone can see, the St. Barbara Church HVAC system has been completed and is running. The total cost of the project was \$329,781 and includes additional costs paid to Peoples Gas and for the fence/barrier. As of today, we have collected \$59,000 from our generous donors in the parish campaign. With a \$100,000 from "To Teach Who Christ Is" (TTWCI) and \$100,000 in matching donations we are \$50,000 short from the original goal, plus another \$20,000 to full project costs. Please note that to finish the project we got a loan from the Archdiocese. The loan balance to be paid as of today is \$34,443. You can still donate! You can still help! You can still earn your donor plaque! Now that the system is complete and working you can be sure that your donation is put to good use. If you still have not made your donation, please do so soon. If you can donate more, please help us. You can write a check, give online, or bring cash. We will accept additional donations for St. Barbara Church HVAC until October 15, 2023. After this date we will make plaques to honor all our donors and place it in St. Barbara Church. Thank YOU!!




