RESPECT LIFE

Racism – As followers of Christ, we seek to reclaim the God-given sanctity of each person's inviolable human dignity. The bishops remind us, "The command of love requires us to make room for others in our hearts. It means that we are indeed our brother's keeper (see Gn 4:9)." Also, "Racism can only end if we contend with the policies and institutional barriers that perpetuate and preserve the inequality—economic and social that we still see all around us." Often, leaders of the Church have not timely voiced against the horrific violence and racial injustices perpetuated against others. Reflecting on these realities, the bishops implore us to find ways to actively work against the evil of racism, to seek racial justice within our Church and in our country. May we all allow the Holy Spirit to convert our hearts to do the work of healing, so we may live authentically in true relationship to one another. (1) Listen to and know the stories of others who have suffered from racism in history and in the present. For some, this will mean actively seeking opportunities to engage with people of diverse backgrounds. For others, this might mean raising your voice or sharing your story. (2) Work to address both individual and systemic racism. Commit to learning more about racism and employment, housing, wealth, education, criminal justice, and voting-and then get involved in diocesan, parish or community efforts to pray and work for conversion of both hearts and systems. (3) Think about what you can do, wherever you are, and commit to raising your awareness in whatever situations you find yourself. a. As people of faith, actively work to create spaces of welcome for encounter and opportunities for sharing of stories, and learn how racism impacts our communities; as leaders and volunteers in parish ministry, regularly think about whose voices may be missing. b. In our family, create opportunities to interact with all of diverse backgrounds whom we socialize with occasionally or on a regular basis; as parents, continue to talk with our children about everyone's human dignity and the pain of racism in our country will help form them to respect the dignity of all. c. At school or work, seek available resources to learn more about other cultures, and be ready to speak up if there are others who are treated differently because of their race. (4) As individuals and communities of faith, examine vour conscience: Do I show Christ's love in my daily life? Do I hold attitudes devaluing other persons? Do I welcome the story of other's life, struggles and joys, or unnecessarily allow a preconceived notion to overshadow that person's human nature? 
