Eucharistic Revival

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink.... Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me" (Jn 6:53-57).

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Church invites us to celebrate the gift of Eucharist and to renew our love for the Eucharist. How do you participate as individuals, as a family and as a community? If you are parents, how do you help your children to participate?

We are in the midst of the National Eucharistic Revival, which has a strategic three-year focus for formation and missionary discipleship beginning at the grassroots level in individual dioceses, parishes and other Catholic institutions:

• Year One (June 2022-June 2023) will be the *Year of Diocesan Revival* in which U.S. bishops respond to the Lord's personal invitation and empower their presbyterates and parish leaders to host events with a Eucharistic focus. Trained pastors comprising the National Eucharistic Preachers initiative have also been commissioned to speak at diocesan events.

• Year Two (June 2023-June 2024) is planned as the *Year of Parish Revival*. Individual pastors will engage their staff and parishioners with community-specific activities and events such as catechetical formation on the Real Presence of Christ, opportunities to better understand and enter more deeply into the Paschal Mystery through the celebration of the Mass, and extended opportunities for Adoration and Reconciliation.

• Year Three is the *Year of the National Eucharistic Congress and Missionary Sending* and commences with a National Eucharistic Congress set to take place July 17-21, 2024 in Indianapolis, IN.

I plan to share more information with you as the *Year of Parish Revival* continues to unfold. I invite all of our parishioners to fully take advantage of this year, in solidarity with the local and universal Church, to engage in the Revival. Please keep this intention in your prayers.

Bishop Sheen and the Eucharist by Fr. Cuff

Years before we had Mother Angelica and her Eternal Word Television Network, there was Bishop Fulton J. Sheen and his "Life Is Worth Living" weekly TV series that was very popular in the 50s and 60s. The Bishop was a well-known preacher and media celebrity of that era, who had not only converted several Hollywood movie stars, but who still found time to make a Holy Hour each morning before the Blessed Sacrament. When asked in a TV interview about this, Bishop Sheen said that what had inspired him was a story he'd heard from a missionary priest he'd met who had just been expelled from China. As related by Bishop Sheen:

"When the Communists took over China, they went to one church and locked up the priest in his own house. That became his jail. Then they went into the church, broke into the tabernacle, scattered the Sacred Hosts on the floor, and left. They did not notice a young girl kneeling in prayer. That night she returned, silently sneaking past the guards at the priest house, before entering the cold dark church. There she knelt in a holy hour of prayer before going up to the sanctuary to receive her Lord and her God in Holy Communion.

"At that time Communion was allowed only once a day and received on the tongue. For this reason the little girl came back each night until she consumed all of the sacred hosts. Each time she lowered her head to the floor and received Jesus with her tongue, one host at a time. All this was witnessed by the parish priest from his window, as he watched the little girl by moonlight. He knew exactly how many hosts were in the ciborium because it was he who had counted them and consecrated them. When the last host was consumed on the thirty-sixth night, the little girl was discovered by the guards as she was leaving. They grabbed her and beat her to death."

Bishop Sheen went on to say that, inspired by her example, that from that day on, he resolved to make a daily Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament, which he did every morning. How many of us present-day Catholics, living in a society with religious freedom, even if we can't make a daily Holy Hour like Bishop Sheen, will still seek to emulate this little girl's faith through devout adoration or by receiving Christ's Body at Sunday Mass or daily Mass whenever we can?


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
