ST. BARBARA CHURCH'S HVAC PROJECT



A Reflection by Parishioner Roberta Cheong: Planting Seeds, Part IV

To love the salvation of every person's soul and the work of evangelizing them is the mission that Jesus gave us all to do on Earth. This is the mission of every Catholic. In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus left us with these final words on Earth, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." This is called "The Great Commission."

Then how do we *make* disciples of Jesus everywhere we go? I used to be very hesitant to evangelize, because I didn't really know how to. But then I changed the way I looked at it and I realized that evangelization—in the simplest terms—is befriending strangers (or talking to people who are already my friends) and then introducing them to Jesus Christ, my closest friend, my Lord, and my God. The better I know Jesus, the better I can tell people about Him. The goal is for them to know God personally, to know His teachings and commandments, to love God, to have an intimate and lifelong relationship with God, and for them to follow Jesus and become His missionary disciple too.

No one were better evangelists than Jesus and His apostles. Let's recall how Jesus evangelized. One way was by healing people, casting out demons, and performing miracles. Another way was by forgiving sins (John 8:1-11). Yet another way was by talking one-on-one to every type of person, even when it was against social norms to do so, such as the woman at the well (John 4:4-42). Jesus met her where she was, literally and figuratively, and we can do the same. We can meet people wherever they are in their faith journey to Christ. Jesus Himself said, "To the other towns also I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God, because for this purpose I have been sent." He was preaching in the synagogues (Luke 4:43-44). We, also, must go and proclaim the Good News, because for this purpose we have been sent too!

How did the apostles evangelize? In Acts 2:14-41, Peter—after receiving the Holy Spirit at Pentecost—delivered an extraordinary and powerful speech to the Jews about how Jesus was the Lord and Messiah, how Jesus was crucified by the Jews, that Jesus was resurrected from the dead, raised up to Heaven and now sits at the right hand of God, and then he said, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the holy Spirit... Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." 3,000 people were immediately converted and baptized as a result. Wow! I believe Peter gave us a perfect example on how to proclaim the gospel and evangelize successfully. I thought, "Why was Peter's speech so effective?" One reason was because the gospel message is inherently powerful. Another reason was because Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit was speaking through him. St. Paul made this point when he said, "When I came to you, brothers, proclaiming the mystery of God, I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified... and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive (words of) wisdom, but with a demonstration of spirit and power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God" (1 Corinthians 2:1-2, 4-5). It was also the Holy Spirit that gave Peter the courage to proclaim the gospel to the thousands of Jews amid fear of persecution at the time.

THE UNHAPPY ELDER SON by Fr. John Cuff

After reading to her class the parable of the Prodigal Son, a Sunday school teacher asked, "OK kids, at the end of the story, who would you say was the most unhappy?" Sure enough, all hands shot up and the answer came back, "The fatted calf!" The answer the teacher was looking for was "The elder son."

There are three main characters in the Parable of the Prodigal Son: the father, the younger son, and the elder son. First we meet the younger son, a volatile, impatient, easily bored, ready-to-try-everything teenager. He collects his inheritance, goes abroad to see the world, and squanders his birthright in loose living. He represents every sinner. In sin we squander our human and divine birthright, and only later we realize our mistake. Sin promises us a life of happiness, satisfaction and excitement, but in the end all we get is misery, wretchedness, dissatisfaction, and a loss of a sense of personal dignity that belongs to us as God's children. But the good news is that no matter how far we fall, there is always a still, silent inner voice within us inviting us to come back to our Father's house where true freedom and satisfaction are to be found.

Secondly, we meet the father who is so loving that he lets his rascally younger son have whatever he wants. In fact, we might even say he spoils the boy. The image of God, then, as a stern, demanding father, always ready to whip us into line, is far from the image of God that we have in this parable, where God is presented as a tender loving father who is easy on his children and always ready to forgive, no matter what. If this is how God relates to us, then we can see that He possesses the tender-loving quality of mother as well as the tough-loving quality of father.

Finally, there's the elder son whom the teacher wanted to focus upon. In one word, he's the perfect gentleman, a man of honor, solid, hard-working, disciplined. In him we see the virtues, as well as the vices, of middle-class morality, vices such as arrogance, better-than-thou attitude, intolerance toward those who don't meet our standards, insensitivity, and a spirit of unforgiveness, as shown in the way he refuses to welcome his long-lost brother, his father's explanation and invitation notwithstanding. For him, it's all about justice. To be a Christian, however, is to live according to the example and teaching of Christ, who showed love and compassion both in his teachings and in his dealings with others. The parable of the Prodigal Son reminds us that for God, love and compassion takes precedence over blind justice. The challenge for us Christians is to be like the prodigal father in the parable and not like the uncompromising elder son, in a world full of prodigal sons and daughters.

This week Grades 1-8 students celebrated our first All School Mass at the St. Therese Worship Site. Thanks to our wonderful benefactors, we were able to give 14 scholarships this year.

The **Woodrow Lee Scholarship Fund** was started by Mr. Lee to give back to the community he cherished. Mr. Lee was an instrumental member of the Chinatown community. Not only was he born and raised in Chicago's Chinatown, but he was also baptized at St. Therese Church and was one of the first students to attend St. Therese School. Congratulations to **Sofia Master**, recipient of this year's Woodrow Lee Scholarship Award.

The Justice Laura Liu Scholarship Fund was created by Mr. Michael Kasper in Justice Liu's honor, to give back to the underserved Asian American community. Justice Liu was a trailblazer for Asian Americans in Illinois' judicial history. She was the first Chinese American judge in Illinois history and was also the first Asian American to serve on the Illinois Appellate Court. In addition, she was a president of the Chinese American Bar Association. Justice Liu helped to make the Illinois court system more accessible to non-native speakers. Congratulations to the recipients Wesley Lo, Cassie Li, Isabella Ponce, Ethan Moy, Ryan Fung, Emma Chan, Aryanna Eng, and Sienna Wong.

The *Tong Family Scholarship Fund* was started by Mr. Tong to help those, who like him, may have come from humble beginnings but go on to achieve great educational and personal success. Mr. and Mrs. Tong were residents of Chicago's Chinatown - Mr. Tong's family lived next door to St. Therese Church! Mr. Tong was a champion of Asian American causes and actively participated in civic and professional organizations. *Congratulations to Jocelyn Lin, Jocelyn Wong, Kaitlin Chenzhen, Natalie Kou, and Addison Lowe, recipients of this year's Tong Family Scholarship Award.*

Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.


