There are many questions in our lives. Many are provoked by events and situations which happen, usually things we cannot control or think we are prepared for, or do not have the answers. Some answers come through prayer or can be found in discussions with people who have experience and wisdom. Some answers we may even find on the computer. We often look for directions on driving somewhere new to us.

The Jewish people had been waiting for the coming of the savior, promised by God to Adam and Eve, for many hundreds of years. Scripture had given them some clues of what would indicate his coming. Isaiah foretold many things about the coming savior. Today's Gospel shows us John the Baptist, coming like a prophet of the Old Testament. DON'T WORRY, BE HAPPY by Fr. John Cuff

This third Sunday of Advent is called "Rejoice Sunday," and in his Letter to the Philippians, St. Paul emphasizes joy: "Rejoice in the Lord always" (4:4) and "Do not worry about anything." (4:6). This recalls the song by Bobby McFerrin, "Don't Worry, Be Happy." Life is full of problems, as McFerrin admits, yet he goes on to advise us not to worry:

In every life we have some trouble/ when you worry you make it double/ Don't worry, be happy.

Ain't got no place to lay your head/ Somebody came and took your bed/ Don't worry, be happy.

The landlord say your rent is late/ He may have to litigate/ Don't worry, be happy.

Ain't got no cash, ain't got no style/ Ain't got no gal to make you smile/ Don't worry, be happy.

Yet there's a big difference between St. Paul and Bobby McFerrin on this issue. McFerrin tells us, "Don't worry, be happy" without telling us why we should be happy and more importantly how to not worry. Paul, on the other hand tells us in today's reading both why we should be happy and how we can dissolve our worries and attain happiness. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near." In other words, we should be happy, not because everything is going our way, or because our health and finances are in great shape, not even because someone has bought us a big Christmas present, but because the Lord is near.

A friend who was diagnosed with leukemia asked before he died, "But why me? I never smoked or touched a drink in my life. I know people who smoke and drink and do all the wrong things, and yet they never got cancer. So why me?" I wish I had the answer; no one does. But today St. Paul reassures us that the coming of the Lord will be a happy surprise for those who believe and hope in Him. Recall that Paul writes these words from inside a Roman prison where he's not sure of coming out alive. So he teaches us not only by word but by example.

It's one thing to know why we shouldn't worry and another to know how not to worry. How can we keep from worrying when surrounded by apparently insurmountable problems and difficulties? Again Paul gives the answer: "Don't worry about anything, but in everything, by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be known to God." In every difficulty or problem, there's one thing we should do rather than worry, and that is to take it to the Lord in prayer. We don't deny we have worries but we must turn those worries into prayers. That's how, St. Paul tells us, that we're able to arrive at that inner peace which people around us cannot understand. So let us "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say Rejoice!"
