SYNOD REGARDING SYNODALITY—Sister Caritas

In our times there are many international organizations. Some groups have local meetings, and some have worldwide organizational meetings. Our Catholic Church is international for many centuries. At this time, the Pope has called an international meeting in Rome, called a Bishops Synod. One hundred and sixty-five Bishops are meeting with the Pope. This is only a small portion of the actual number of Bishops worldwide.

The Synod began October,2021. This first phase of the Synod deals with clarifying the process used in synods. The first step is to develop a dialogue, communication, sharing, among the local bishops and the local members of the parishes. Listening to each other, sharing the understanding and meanings with each other and the local bishops, and being open to the action and voice of the Holy Spirit leading us to common understandings and actions is the call of the

bility and weakness of God?

True: Christ is an all-powerful King, one who will return to earth, specifically to save those who patiently wait. It is simultaneously true that the body of Christ is broken. What can Jesus' broken body practically do for evangelizers?

I cherish opportunities like these, witnessing a love for Christ more radically. Outside the security of a classroom, Jesus invites me to flip the script. On the streets of Bridgeport and Chinatown, it's my motives, not those I am trying to reach out to, that need evaluation. As Fr. Richard Rohr consistently states, "The only thing Jesus excludes is exclusion."

St. Francis initiated such an 'unofficial movement' hundreds of years ago. He invited members of his community to witness their love for Christ not by waiting for someone to show up and listen to a friar's wonderful spiritual insights but rather by engaging in an outwardly focused mission. Thanks to God, this incarnational approach, out on the margins of society, has touched and inspired many.

The alleyways around here sustain some strange smells. Sister Monica, no doubt, has a good chance here in this picture to "smell like a sheep." Sharing an authentic witness necessitates growing in solidarity, not separation, with one's neighbor.

My experience tells me that it's often more effective to stand alongside a garbage can and reach out to a stranger than stand behind a podium and teach those who have to show up anyway. If you are interested in street evangelization, you can go out on Mondays at 4 p.m. with the Missionaries of Charity or contact me

If you want to do some research or reading there is a book, "The Documents of the Vatican II". You may find it on the computer. The first section of the documents is, "The Church." This present synod points to the importance of all the "people of God" as the Church, not just the Pope and Bishops and other clerical leaders. We are all called to listen to the Holy Spirit and open ourselves to the guidance of the Spirit so we can reach out and evangelize the world, the people in our world, family, neighborhood and friends. Take your courage and the grace of God in your hands and "Go into the whole world and preach the Gospel to every creature."

CHOOSING THE NARROW PATH by Fr. John Cuff

Each November, the month of the Holy Souls, the Church invites us to take a fresh hard look at our death and the "Four Last Things"; Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell (also Purgatory) that each of us will have to face. Here are some thoughts of Pope Benedict XVI from his 2007 encyclical "Spe Salvi" about our final destiny. The path we choose is a matter of (eternal) life or (eternal) death. The Pope wrote:

45... "With death, our life-choice becomes definitive---our life stands before the judge. Our choice, which in the course of an entire life takes on a certain shape, can have a variety of forms:

(On those whose path leads to Hell)

There can be people who have totally destroyed their desire for truth and readiness to love, people for whom everything has become a lie, people who have lived for hatred and have suppressed all love within themselves. This is a terrifying thought, but alarming profiles of this type can be seen in certain figures of our own history. In such people all would be beyond remedy and the destruction of good would be irrevocable: this is what we mean by the word Hell.

(On those whose path leads to Heaven)

On the other hand there can be people who are utterly pure, completely permeated by God, and thus fully opened to their neighbors---people for whom communion with God even now gives direction to their entire being, and whose journey towards God only brings to fulfillment what they already are.

(On those who are neither totally evil nor obviously saintly)

46.... Yet we know from experience that neither case is normal in human life. For the great majority of people---we may suppose---there remains in the depths of their being an ultimate interior openness to truth, to love, to God. In the concrete choices of life, however, it is covered over by ever new compromises with evil---much filth covers purity, but the thirst for purity remains and it still constantly re-emerges from all that is base and remains present in the soul."

At the end of the Church year, we need to reflect seriously upon which path we are on. God has shown us the path to life. Let us walk it with Jesus. Let's not be deceived by the temporary allurements of this world but cling to what is eternal. We need not wait for the hour of our death; we must take to heart the words of Pope Benedict now. Let this be the moment to abandon ourselves definitively to the Father's love by walking the narrow path.


