"Son of God" by Sr. Caritas

If you are really going to experience an event, you must be able to express what the event was in words. John the Baptist recognizes Jesus and says, "Behold the Lamb of God." That phrase becomes a special way to identify Jesus. John testifies, "I saw the Spirit come down, like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. When you see this, He is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit. He is the Son of God." The expression of this mystery helps us understand how God is revealed to us. In order to be able to recognize

God revealing Himself to you, we have to have an openness of Spirit in our being. This will teach us to know God and how to share Him with others. It is not enough to know God, but we are called to share God with others.

When we open our spirit to God, God comes and fills our lives, our families, institutions and all the times of our lives with His presence in us and with us wherever we may be. When we are open, God teaches us to recognize Him wherever we may be. We recognize His fingerprints in events and places, in others' word and actions as well as in ourselves. We see God with us. We ask God to help us bring Him into other peoples' lives. God always acts if we ask Him to be present and fill our lives with His actions and words. We give God thanks.

MATTY'S ELUSIVE SIGN by Fr. Cuff

Matty knows that as a Catholic he should be winning souls for Christ. In the parish Bible class he's practiced how to share his faith with people and lead them to Christ, but till now he's never done so. So he prays to God to give him a sign to know exactly when to start his mission of introducing others to Christ. One day he's travelling on the subway with his Bible in his handbag. A young man about his own age enters the train and sits next to Matty. He wears a T-shirt with the slogan, "whoever has the most toys wins." Matty bends his head and says a little prayer, "Lord, give me a sign when to start." The young man's cell phone rings. A friend wants him to pick him up at church. After arguing with his friend awhile, he says, "All right, but I'm not entering the church. I'll be waiting in the parking lot," and hangs up. Matty bends his head a second time and prays, "Lord, I'm still waiting for a sign!" Finally, the young man turns to Matty and says, "You know, I've got this weird friend who skips work on Sundays so he can go to church. I just don't get it." Matty smiles, closes his eyes again and prays, "Lord, a sign, a sign!" End of story.

In today's Gospel Jesus begins his public life. After living a hidden life for thirty years, how did he know when to leave home and begin his public life? Our first thought is that God his Father spoke to him and communicated to him exactly when to begin, that he got a special green light from God; but today's Gospel suggests Jesus probably arrived at his decision the way most people do, that is, by inferring from the things happening in their lives what God is trying to say to them. Our Gospel reading begins, "When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth making his home in Capernaum by the sea." Jesus hears that John has been arrested. He figures that the renewal movement that John started will now be needing a new leader; he looks around and finds that no one is more suited than himself. That's it. That is all the sign he needs. He says farewell to his family and moves on to meet the challenges of his public life. Unlike Matty in our story, Jesus does not sit and wait for a special supernatural sign from above; rather, he learns to read the "signs of the times," that is, to infer from the goings-on in the world around him what God is saying to him.

What needs do we see in the world around us? What can we do about it, given the personal circumstances in our lives? Are we like Matty waiting for a special sign from God? Well, that sign may never come. Let's ask God today to give us the wisdom to read the "signs of the times" and in our own lives as Jesus did, and to know what God expects of us both as individuals and as a parish. And let us ask for the courage to start doing it, not just praying for a special sign before we take action in our God-given mission in life.


Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
