Prayer: individual and in community, reflective directed prayer

Evangelization: bring people to Jesus, including our specially entrusted ministry of the Chinese apostolate

Education: Elementary school; also other education opportunities, especially for adults

Social Activities: sports, picnics, concerts, and so forth

Liturgy: specific ministry planning- servers, music, lectors

Compassionate Ministry: outreach to the needy and the poor

FURTHER EVIDENCE OF THE RESURRECTION Fr. John Cuff

As the close of the Easter season draws near, it's fitting to remember that besides the empty tomb, another "proof" of the Resurrection is that after Christ's glorified body ascends into heaven, He continues to live on in his Church through His Spirit. Here's a story to illustrate how Christ lives on in His believers:

During the Industrial Revolution, a well-known atheist professor would go on lecture tours throughout England speaking on the subject of religion. He once visited a small mining town in the midlands to speak to a group of poor illiterate miners. His lecture was entitled, "How I explain Christ." In his talk he raised many challenges to the Gospel story and concluded by telling his listeners that Christ never existed. At the end of his lecture he said, "And so, my friends, the Bible is nonsense; it is all made up. As for Jesus Christ, why, He is nothing but a myth; and that is how I explain Christ. Are there any questions?"

After a short silence a miner in working clothes stood up and said, "Professor, sir, I'm just a poor uneducated miner. I never went to school and don't even know the meaning of the word 'myth.' But there's one thing I do know. Three years ago I had a miserable home. I neglected my family and spent my money on drink and gambling; I couldn't find a job and there was no peace in my heart. Then a friend took me aside and told me about God and our Savior Jesus; I was baptized and became a believer. Since that day my life has changed completely. Now I have a happy home, I have given up drink and gambling and my former companions. I spend my spare time with my wife and children; we sing, dance, tell stories, and pray together. Now I have peace and joy in my heart. Professor, we've heard how you explain Jesus. But how do you explain me?" I think this story can show how Christ continues to live on in His believers and enables them to change their lives.

The "evidence" for the Resurrection is seen not only in the "empty tomb," but also in the impact of the Resurrection upon Christ's believers. This is why we rejoice at Easter: not only because Jesus has conquered death and has ascended to the right hand of the Father, but because we realize that He is still with us. He lives within us, and is present in His Church through His Spirit, in you and me and in the newly baptized. That is what we celebrate at Easter. Alleluia!
