# **Renewing Our Love for the Eucharist (continued)**

Our Parish's "Teaching Mass" went well last weekend at St. Therese Site. Thanks to **Jade Yee** for leading it, **Ken Ricci** for the script, and the rest of the Liturgy Committee and all others who cooperated to make it happen.

This weekend, Ken will lead the "Teaching Mass" at St. Barbara Site. I hope our parish's Teaching Mass can help us individually and collectively to renew our knowledge as well as our appreciation for the Eucharist.

In his exhortation letter on *The Liturgical Formation of the People of God*, Pope Francis taught us on the importance of formation of the Liturgy and being formed by the Liturgy as people of God. He also beautifully connected our liturgical celebrations with our everyday living as missionary disciples by stating, "A celebration that does not evangelize is not authentic, just as a proclamation that does not lead to an encounter with the Risen Lord in the celebration is not authentic. And then both of these, without the testimony of charity, are like sounding a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal" (1 Cor. 13:1).

At the end of each Mass, we are sent out to love and serve God's people. The nourishments we received at Mass have to be shared with the people we encounter in our family, workplace, and the World. We must allow the Eucharist to transform our lives and we must strive to transform the lives of others.

# Should we approach God in Fear or in Hope? --John Lin

This is one of the reflection questions given by Fr. Cuff in his recent Advent Retreat in our parish.

He pointed out that the Gospel reading of the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of Advent (Mt. 11:2-11) shows the transition of the Old Testament period where John the Baptist lives into the New Testament period of Jesus. John the Baptist focused on the Final Judgement and therefore asked us to repent our sins.

Jesus starts the Fulfillment period where Isaiah (Is 35:5) described "the blind regains their sight,

the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them". Remember the parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11–32) Jesus told us? God will give us an open arm to receive us sinners when we go back to Him.

My short answer is I'll approach God in Hope, Love and Thanksgiving! But Do we have to experience pain and suffering before we find God? That's a discussion for next time!

耶穌開始了依撒意亞所描述的履行時代:"瞎子看見,瘸子行走,癩病人得了潔淨,聾子聽見,死人復活,窮苦人得了喜訊。"(依35:5)。還記得耶穌給我們講的浪子回頭(路15:11-32)的比喻嗎?當我們回到他身邊時,天主會張開雙臂接納我們這些罪人。

所以我的簡短回答是我會在希望、愛和感恩中接近天 主! 但是,在找到天主之前,我們是否必須經歷痛苦和 磨難? 那是下一次的討論!


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
