


Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

History of the Sacred Heart Devotion



The following short history is taken from <u>Sacred Heart of Jesus | EWTN</u>.

The foundation for the Sacred Heart devotion began in early Christianity. Sacred Scripture, particularly the New Testament, mentions the love of God many times, and the Church Fathers discuss God's love as well.

In the eleventh century, Christians often meditated on the Five Wounds of Jesus, and the specific devotion to the Sacred Heart came from this meditation. St. Gertrude the Great, who had private revelations regarding the Sacred Heart, helped further the understanding of Jesus' Sacred Heart in the late 13th-century.

Several centuries later, in 1670, St. John Eudes celebrated the first Feast of the Sacred Heart. In 1673, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French Visitation nun, received her own revelations, in which Jesus explained His love for all people, even allowing St. Margaret to lay her head on His Heart, as He had also allowed St. Gertrude to do. He asked that Catholics receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays of the month and adore Him in the Holy Eucharist.

In 1675, Jesus told St. Margaret that He wanted an annual feast in honor of His Sacred Heart. In 1856, Blessed Pope Pius IX designated that the Feast of the Sacred Heart would be celebrated universally on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave each year.

Here in our parish, our *First Friday devotion takes place immediately after the 8am mass at St. Therese Church.* I encourage you to participate and cultivate our love for the Heart of Jesus.

On this Father's Day weekend, we thank God for our fathers and entrust them to the mercy and protection of the Heart of Jesus and of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. May the good Lord watch over ad bless all fathers. May they continue to strive to be responsible and committed role models for others.

BE LIKE JESUS by Sr. Caritas

There are times in our lives when we may be zealous and want to spread the word of God, the message of Jesus. Where should you go? Where do you start? How do you start? What do you say first?

If we were to copy Jesus himself, we would take time to look through the teaching years of Jesus, we could find an answer to that question. Jesus began where the people were. He took the situations, the experiences, the places where he met the people and started there. Sometimes he would find himself in the midst of the poor or the hungry. He took the situation he was in and made the most of it. There were also times when Jesus would find Himself in the temple, in the midst of the Jewish religious leaders and teachers. The Jewish faith community would also be there. Sometimes He was by the seashore or on top of a mountain or be in the midst of little children. In all these places and situations, He was in the midst of God's presence.

In today's Gospel, we are shown a glimpse of the compassion heart of Jesus. He looks at all the people who make up the Jewish crowd around Him. He sees how lost they are. He sees how much the people need direction, teaching, compassion, care. All these are the elements of Jesus' teaching and life. Jesus calls the twelve Apostles. They have been with Him, watching, listening, doing what He tells them. They are trying to change their lives so they could be more like Him. Jesus gives the twelve Apostles power over "unclean spirits", and tells "The Twelve" to seek out the "Lost sheep of the house of Israel." He gives them clear directions where they are to go. and what they are to do. "Cure the sick, cast out evil spirits, raise the dead." Jesus tells them to do what He did. "Proclaim, the kingdom of God is at hand." Jesus continues His directives and teaching.

We have been freely given the gift of Baptism which transforms and graces us with the power to act and be like Jesus. Do what He did. Love as He loves us.

Will you do what Jesus did and does? Look for the examples in our lives. Today's holiday points to some examples, our fathers. Be like Jesus. God and do likewise.

GIVING BACK GENEROUSLY by Fr. Cuff

There are two seas in the Holy Land: the Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea. Both seas (lakes, in fact) are fed by the same river, the River Jordan. One's a freshwater lake teaming with fish, whereas the other is a superconcentrated body of salt-water in which nothing can live. If both seas are fed by the same river, why is one fresh and life-giving while the other is dead? It's because the Sea of Galilee has an outlet for letting out water whereas the Dead Sea has no such outlet. In other words, the Sea of Galilee receives and gives out water continually, whereas the Dead Sea only receives and does not emit water except through evaporation. Similarly, like the two seas, giving and receiving keeps us alive and life-giving, while receiving without giving renders us stagnant and dead.

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends out his Apostles with the admonition that they must be willing to give back some of what they've received: "You received without payment; give without payment." Missionary generosity, giving of oneself, one's time and resources in the service of God's Kingdom, is possible only when we realize that all we are and have, including life itself, is a gift from God. As St. Paul says, "What do you have that you did not receive?" Being a Christian is, in fact, a life of conscious receiving and giving back to God. Unfortunately we often pay more attention to receiving than giving. As God's children we received the grace of faith, forgiveness, the Word of God, the Sacraments, and new life in the Spirit. But we only complete the circuit of God's grace when we go out and share these same blessings with those who don't yet have them. Failing to do so, we become like the Dead Sea, stagnant and dead because it only receives and does not give back.

So where to begin, one may ask? Jesus instructs the Apostles to start with **"the lost sheep of the house of Israel."** That is to say, start from familiar territory. Later on He will commission them to go and make disciples of all nations, but for now they must limit their outreach to within their own people. Mission, like charity, begins at home. One place for us to begin, therefore, would be with the lapsed and lukewarm members of our own families and parish. To do so will prepare us to be missionaries to others. But we must find an avenue to give back the faith we've received. That's the only way to remain alive and vibrant in the faith like the fresh and life-giving Sea of Galilee.


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
