

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The seminarians preparing to be the future priests who will serve our parishes are a great blessing to us. They have stepped forward to give their lives to minister to the children and grandchildren of this present era. Today, more than ever, we need compassionate and knowledgeable priests who will walk with us through life, sharing in our joys and sorrows and guiding us through life's challenges.

This is why we need to invest in their training at both the University of Saint Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary and at Saint John Vianney College Seminary in Saint Paul, Minnesota. HOW DO YOU SERVE? By Sister Caritas

One of the jobs I had as I was growing up at home, was to do the grocery shopping for the family weekly. Obviously, my Mom taught me how to shop and handle money, as well as what she meant by the things she wrote on the grocery list. My brother, Ronald, next to me in age, and I would take our wagon with us to the grocery store. My Mother trusted me with the money we needed to purchase the groceries, as there was no such thing as credit cards then. My parents were of the opinion that if you couldn't pay for it you could not buy it. I brought the change home carefully. This was one of the ways I served my family and helped my mother, as she tried, with my father and then my step-father, to raise a family of five children.

Today the Gospel presents Jesus telling a parable or story. The story tells of the servant who was squandering his master's property. The Master berated the unworthy servant who he was firing. The servant reflected on what to do and decided to make arrangements with those who purchased the master's commodities. The servant would charge less for what those people would buy and that way he would have "friends" he could turn to when he no longer had a job. The Master recognized what the servant did and praised him for his foresight, but he still lost his job.

Jesus used this parable to teach His disciples the importance of really, completely serving the master who "hired you." Who is the one Mater you are serving or are called to serve? Who is the one Master Jesus served in His life? The "Master" Jesus served completely was God, His Father. Who are the "masters" you try to serve in your life? Is it money, material things, or is it God whom you serve by keeping the ten commandments and following Jesus' teachings? The challenge can be difficult to sort out and see in your own life what you are really doing. What do you put first in your life? What do you usually choose when it comes to God and God's laws or the demands of acquisition of material goods, good reputation, or the calls of temptation to sin in our lives? Putting God first in our values and choices is not always easy. Take time to look at how you make choices and what you choose and why: "No man can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other or be devoted to one and despise the other".
