

CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUYA!

The heroic resistance of the Ukrainian people in the capital city of Kiev to the recent Russian invasion brings to mind an incident that occurred nearly a century ago, also in Kiev, which deserves mention during this Easter season.

The year was 1930; at that time the Communist Party was just beginning to consolidate its power over the Ukrainian people. The Communist party leader Bukharin had come from Moscow to address a huge assembly of ordinary citizens of the city of Kiev who were forced to attend his lecture; his subject was atheism. For a whole hour Bukharin aimed his attacks at Christianity, mixing argument and ridicule against the Church. Meanwhile, the audience sat silently; no one dared say a word. When Bukharin was finished, he thought he had finally destroyed the whole idea of religion in the minds of his listeners. "Are there any questions?" he demanded.

A soldier in the audience asked permission to speak and was allowed; he slowly mounted the platform and walked over to Bukharin; the audience was breathlessly silent as the man stood at the microphone for a moment, looking right and left over the great crowd. At last, he shouted at the top of his voice the ancient Orthodox Easter greeting, "CHRIST IS RISEN!" Suddenly the vast assembly rose as one man, and the response came crashing back like the roaring sound of an avalanche "HE IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUYA!", the traditional Easter response.

We don't know if that soldier lived very long after that. It's doubtful. But our faith assures us of one thing: Christ will acknowledge that soldier and his fellow countrymen before their heavenly Father on the last day. They were not afraid to acknowledge their Easter faith because of Christ's words, "Do not fear those who can kill the body but not the soul." Jesus also says, "Everyone who acknowledges me before men, I will acknowledge him before my Father in Heaven." On the other hand, He also says that if we deny Him, He will deny us. When the Church Christ founded is unjustly attacked, when Christ's teachings are ridiculed, how many of us will not be afraid to speak up for our faith?
