#### Lenten Regulations (from March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2022, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

#### LOVE YOUR ENEMIES by Fr. John Cuff

This story from China illustrates Christ's command to "Love your enemies": A Catholic teacher was excellent in languages, good enough to teach English at a university in Beijing. After the Communist victory in 1949, he continued teaching. However, when the Cultural Revolution in 1966 began a persecution of religion, his students rallied against him. They denounced him, cursed him, and beat him. Later he was sent to a labor camp. A few years later he was released and resumed teaching English. He was allowed to teach beyond retirement age since outstanding English teachers were hard to find at that time.

One morning years later the university scheduled an English oral exam, part of the university entrance requirements. Not only secondary school seniors, but also their parents were seated in the waiting room. The parents had come to encourage their children, hoping to increase their odds of being admitted.

Every ten minutes the old professor came into the waiting room and called another name. He looked at the parents and made eye contact. Several of them were his former students, the same ones who had cursed and beaten him 25 years earlier. They sat silently with eyes lowered, filled with hopeless despair. They realized that it was payback time! Now the old professor would have his revenge, fail their son or daughter, and they would have no way of appeal. It was the longest and most miserable morning of their entire lives.

Before lunchtime, the professor posted the names of the successful students, and six or seven children of his old enemies were on the list. The lucky parents couldn't believe their eyes. They came to him and asked, "Professor, after what we did to you, how could you judge our child fairly?" He replied, "I was tempted to get revenge, but Jesus Christ has told me to love my enemies." The parents were so moved that several of them later studied the Catholic faith and were baptized.

In today's first reading David has a golden opportunity to finally dispatch his mortal enemy Saul, but remembering how God had chosen Saul as King, David spares him, to the utter dismay of David's soldiers, but thus gaining for himself God's blessing. How will we act the next time we are tempted to get revenge?



**Dangerous Bills** – Two dangerous pieces of legislation are being considered in the Illinois legislature this February. The first one **HB 4640**, first heard in the Human Service Committee, would create the Access to Public Health Data Act to enable the Department of Public Health to breach Illinois resident's private medical records and adopt "any rules necessary" to "make any and all public health data related to residents of that local health department's jurisdiction available to that local health department for the purposes of preventing or controlling disease, injury, or disability." It would thus give the Department "supreme authority in matters of quarantine and isolation, [so that they] may declare and enforce quarantine and isolation when none exists...." The second bill HB 5048, first heard in the Health Care Licenses Committee in mid-February. concerns with a Practitioner's Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment form (POLST Form). The form is usually filled out and signed when the patient's doctor does not necessarily expect the patient survive another full year. Typically, those filling out the POLST Form are very frail and/or have life-threatening conditions; the form, having life and death consequences, would be handled with the utmost care and respect for the patient.
