A Reflection by Parishioner Roberta Cheung: Planting Seeds, Part I

I've been living in a nursing home for almost 4 years now and the longer I live here, the more clear it is why God put me here. He wants me to evangelize here. It is a nursing home of 200 patients who have an average age of 80. I meet new staff members constantly and I've had about 30 different roommates. We change rooms and roommates frequently. God calls us to evangelize everyone we meet, so I started with my roommate.



When my most recent 83-year-old roommate moved into my room, we got along immediately. We were on the same page about everything! Everything except religion. It turned out that she was born and raised Catholic and she loved being Catholic so much that she almost became a nun. However, when she turned 30, she suddenly left the Catholic

Church to follow the New Age movement. That was the last time she had been to Mass.

As she walked further away from Jesus throughout the decades and deeper into New Age beliefs, she no longer acknowledged that Jesus was her Lord and Savior and she had a hatred for Communion. When she said this, I knew that she did not have the Holy Spirit in her. The Bible says "Therefore, I tell you that nobody speaking by the spirit of God says, 'Jesus be accursed.' And no one can say 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the holy Spirit," (1 Corinthians 12:3). So from that day on, I prayed every day for God to send her the Holy Spirit and for her to return to the Catholic Church. In reply to her, I responded, "Jesus died for us and saved us from our sins" and "I think Communion is the ultimate act of love." We continued to be open and honest with each other about everything, and we acknowledged our differences in religious beliefs while continuing to share our beliefs with each other. She watched TV for most of the day, so when she turned off the TV at night, I immediately started conversations with her about God and other meaningful topics. Both of us enjoyed these late-night conversations and we became good friends.

One time we were talking about the overturning of Roe vs. Wade and she said that she believes a baby gets their soul only when they are born. In shock, I said, "That's not true!" She replied, "Well I don't know if it's true or not, but throughout my life, I've changed my mind many times about many things. Maybe one day I'll change my mind again." To me, she was that 1 lost sheep out of the 100 sheep that Jesus wants to bring back to the fold. She admitted to me that she had never read the Bible. And then I instantly understood why she left the Catholic Church. She never knew her faith. It reminded me that an archbishop once said that everyone who left the Catholic Church never truly understood Catholicism and didn't understand what they were leaving. They left because of what they (erroneously) thought the Catholic Church taught, not what the Catholic Church actually taught. They were never properly catechized in the Catholic faith.

Along the same lines, Fr. Mitch Pacwa, author of *Catholics And The New Age*, said "Too many people know the Catholic faith too poorly, and as a result, they don't know how to detect these types of counterfeit spiritualities. And what I want people to do is learn their Catholic faith... Read the sacred scriptures first and then *The Catechism (of the Catholic Church)* and read the (Church) Fathers. Know what the Catholic faith teaches so that you can spot these counterfeits, because the counterfeits will lead you away from the true God as any counterfeit will... Counterfeit spirituality serves the enemy of our soul and the kingdom of darkness, not God or His holy kingdom."

Also in the Bible are repeated warnings against following false gods and ideologies and the punishments that happened to people who turned away from God. My roommate was never educated about this. So I emailed her a link to the Bible online. I doubt she will ever open the link to read it. I tried to tell her what was written in the Bible and live out Jesus' teachings and commandments for her to see.

She was bedridden and unable to walk or even stand up. She wore adult diapers that needed to be changed by the staff every two hours or so. One morning, she woke up very cranky and started yelling at every staff member who came into our room. She usually had a very pleasant and kind disposition, so this was not like her at all. She was angry at everyone except me. She told me that she was tired of still being here (on Earth) and she was ready to go to Heaven anytime. In fact, she couldn't wait for her time on Earth to come to an end. She asked me if I felt the same way so that I wouldn't be sick or have to suffer anymore. I answered, "No, because there's value in my suffering. It's helping me be a better person." She instantly lit up and wholeheartedly agreed. She said, "Oh yeah, I believe I'm still here in order to learn patience, humility, love for all people, and kindness by living in a nursing home and being completely helpless and needing to rely on people to do everything for me." That conversation changed her whole mood, reminded her of having hope, and she was back to her old pleasant self again.

On Sundays, I would tell her that I was going to Mass and that I would be gone for most of the day. After she got used to the idea, she would ask me every Sunday, "Are you going to church today? Have fun!" I was going to Mass even when I could barely walk. One time she said to me, "Are you going to church today?! But you can't walk!" I replied, "I'm bringing my walker with me, so that's going to help a lot." I needed to witness to her how important it was for me attend Mass no matter the circumstances.

While I don't know if any of the seeds I tried to plant will bear fruit in the future, I know for sure that the most effective thing I did for my roommate was pray every day for her conversion. It is the Holy Spirit who converts souls after all. She is now in a different room across the hall, but I still pray for her conversion every day. I think it's God's plan that sometimes He sends us to help plant the seeds in a soul, other times He sends us to water the seeds that someone else has planted, sometimes He sends us to bring light to it, or maybe He sends us to do the pruning (correct misunderstandings they have about God and the Catholic faith), and at times He sends us to harvest a faith that many others have worked on along the way. God sends the appropriate people to be in all of our lives at the perfect time. I pray that God will continue to send more Catholics into my roommate's life to plant more seeds and to nourish what has already been planted so that one day she will become a plant that bears much fruit for the Kingdom of God.

BEING FIRST OR LAST by Sister Caritas

When we look at the world of people, we see all kinds of people. We see old, young, tall, short, smart and brilliant or people at the other end of the spectrum of intelligence. We, ourselves, fit into some of these categories. If we look at our families, we find a variety of people even though we are all related. In our families, we all have different relationships and, as children, we all have or had different relationships with our parents. Parents teach us and as the scripture in today's readings say, parents discipline their children. Each of us has difficult times in our lives. Sometimes it seems that around every corner in our everyday lives, there is another challenge, another difficulty, a different hardship. We may at that moment, look up to God and wonder or ask, "What's going on?" We may look to God for help. Perhaps, some of those times of prayer in Jesus' life when He went out to be with His father, were times when He asked help from His Father. Every Father disciplines his child.

These actions are usually done out of love.

Jesus was asked, in a town, "Are only a few people going to be saved?" I've heard that question even from people I have known. Jesus reminds us that it is not an easy road to heaven. Not everyone has the strength, or has a strong enough desire, to walk the road to salvation and heaven. Many times in my life, I have learned that I do not have the strength on my own. If I reach out to God and ask His help or ask Him to live that part of my life, I find a new and different kind of strength, grace. It is, I think, that I am not doing it on my own. God is there with me, walking with me, living that aspect of my life I am having difficulty with at the time. If in our acknowledged weakness, we reach out for the grace, God is always willing to give us help. We will be among those for whom the door is opened when we knock. We may have to knock often, or harder, but God hears us. God "disciplines "us. God loves us. If we are faithful, we may be among the first, not among the last, to have the door opened so we can enter the Kingdom of God.

Life is often a desert, it is difficult to walk, but if we trust in God, it can become beautiful and wide as a highway. Never lose hope; continue to believe, always, in spite of everything. Hope opens new horizons, making us capable of dreaming what is not even imaginable.


Confessions: Saturdays, 4:15-4:45 p.m. at St. Barbara Church or by
