








Prayer of His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI on World Day of Prayer for the Church in China (May 24)!

This coming Wednesday May 24 is the Annual World Day of Prayer for the Church in China, which was proclaimed by Pope Benedict XVI in 2007. In solidary with the universal Church, I invite you to pray the following prayer this week



Virgin Most Holy, Mother of the Incarnate Word and our Mother, venerated in the Shrine of Sheshan under the title "Help of Christians", the entire Church in China looks to you with devout affection. We come before you today to implore your protection. Look upon the People of God and, with a mother's care, guide them along the paths of truth and love, so that they may always be a leaven of harmonious coexistence among all citizens.

When you obediently said "yes" in the house of Nazareth, you allowed God's eternal Son to take flesh in your virginal womb and thus to begin in history the work of our redemption. You willingly and generously cooperated in that work, allowing the sword of pain to pierce your soul, until the supreme hour of the Cross, when you kept watch on Calvary, standing beside your Son, who died that we might live.

From that moment, you became, in a new way, the Mother of all those who receive your Son Jesus in faith and choose to follow in his footsteps by taking up his Cross. Mother of hope, in the darkness of Holy Saturday you journeyed with unfailing trust towards the dawn of Easter.

Grant that your children may discern at all times, even those that are darkest, the signs of God's loving presence. Our Lady of Sheshan, sustain all those in China, who, amid their daily trials, continue to believe, to hope, to love. May they never be afraid to speak of Jesus to the world, and of the world to Jesus.

In the statue overlooking the Shrine you lift your Son on high, offering him to the world with open arms in a gesture of love. Help Catholics always to be credible witnesses to this love, ever clinging to the rock of Peter on which the Church is built. Mother of China and all Asia, pray for us, now and forever. Amen!

MANKIND'S GIANT LEAP by Fr. Cuff

On July 20, 1969, a unique historical event occurred which united all mankind for a few brief moments of genuine togetherness. For the first time, a man, Neil Armstrong, an American astronaut, walked on the moon, an event seen live on TV by millions of people. That evening people interviewed in the U.S. declared, "I'm proud to be an American!" And throughout the world, no matter what nationality, people exclaimed, "I'm proud to be a human being." The next day, newspaper headlines in other countries all over the world were ecstatic: "Great triumph for the human race! Mankind achieves age-old dream to walk on moon! Great victory for humanity! 'One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind!" Even many leftist newspapers, those always criticizing U.S. imperialism, got caught up in the excitement. The China Daily headlines read, "Great Victory for the People! Long live the people!" For one brief moment, politics and ideologies ceased to exist; everyone felt united as brothers and sisters of one human family. Indeed, the whole world rejoiced that a man had walked on the moon. We all felt part of Neil Armstrong's great victory; his accomplishment belonged to all of us.

The Apostles must have felt the same kind of joy when they saw Jesus ascend into heaven. They were eyewitnesses that it was a living, breathing body that rose into the clouds. The message of the Ascension is simple: that we who are Christ's followers can also look forward to the same glorious conclusion of life, to be swept up, body and soul, into heaven. The Christian religion is the only religion to teach that the human body, indeed a transformed, glorified body, will be part of one's everlasting salvation. At the final judgment we'll not simply be "pure spirits" in heaven. The body, which shared in our earthly struggles during life, will also share in the rewards of eternal life. That's why the Apostles returned to Jerusalem "full of joy." They realized that, for the first time, a member of our human race had gone before them and now lived with God. Indeed, just like going to the moon, it was an age-old dream of mankind to one day be re-united with God, to live with God in heaven. Plus, they realized that they too were somehow part of Christ's victory, just like people of the 20th century considered ourselves part of Neil Armstrong's achievement in reaching the moon. Happy Ascension Sunday!
