HAPPY YEAR OF THE RABBIT



The Rabbit represents kindness and courage in the Chinese zodiac, and they tend to be gentle, quiet, elegant, and alert.

Today's Gospel reminds us of our call to be missionary disciples and say "yes" to Jesus in our everyday lives. I think the virtues of "kindness and courage" can help us to be bold and joyful disciples.

Pope Francis in The Joy of the Gospel wrote,

The Gospel joy which enlivens the community of disciples is a missionary joy. The seventy-two disciples felt it as they returned from their mission (cf. Lk 10:17). Jesus felt it when he rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and praised the Father for revealing himself to the poor and the little ones (cf. Lk 10:21). It was felt by the first converts who marvelled to hear the apostles preaching "in the native language of each" (Acts 2:6) on the day of Pentecost. This joy is a sign that the Gospel has been proclaimed and is bearing fruit. Yet the drive to go forth and give, to go out from ourselves, to keep pressing forward in our sowing of the good seed, remains ever present. The Lord says: "Let us go on to the next towns that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out" (Mk 1:38). Once the seed has been sown in one place, Jesus does not stay behind to explain things or to perform more signs; the Spirit moves him to go forth to other towns. (#21).

Perhaps this year, each of us can strive to be intentional evangelizers and our parish can be a strong evangelizing community. Let's pray that the Joy of the Gospel can be experienced in and among us this year.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: Jan. 18---25, 2023 Prayer For Christian Unity

Eternal Father,

We praise you for sending your Son to be one of us and to save us.

Look upon your people with mercy, for we are divided in so many ways, and give us the Spirit of Jesus to make us one in love.

We ask this gift, loving Father, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Respond at Once by Sr. Caritas

Have you ever been invited to something new? Sometimes we are invited to a new group of friends or a new place to live. Maybe we are open to a new learning experience or to meet new people. Each one's life. has many new experiences in it as we go through life. Sometimes we respond with hesitation. Other times, we respond right away and welcome the change and new experience and meeting the new people in the experience.

When John is arrested, Jesus decides to go and live "Capernaum by the sea." This passage tells that Jesus' coming made a land with people sitting in darkness, filled the land with great light. This fulfilled the words of scripture. Jesus, walking along the Sea of Galilee begins building his group of Apostles. He sees Peter and his brother John and calls them from their job as fishing. He makes them "fishers of men." AT ONCE, the two men leave their fishing nets and follow Jesus. Further on the road Jesus finds two more brothers, James and John. Jesus calls them from their boat and their work of helping their father mending nets. They immediately leave all their work and follow Jesus. Jesus and those He called, continued their journey through Galilee healing the sick and preaching the gospel.

This passage reveals the promptness with which the apostles responded to the call of Jesus. They give us an example. How quickly does each of us respond to calls to help the parish or other people? How often do we recognize the various situations calling us to help serve in the parish and in events to help build up the parish. Do we willing participate in Mass, being readers, catechists, and helping in various parish ministries? These are the ways we can follow Jesus as the apostles did. If we do what we can to help build the ministries in our parish, our parish will grow and become a witness in our neighborhoods of the care of Jesus for those in need. "Come and follow."

Please contact parish office for any of the following:


Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
