Responsible Stewards: Funding for St. Barbara HVAC

As I shared two weeks ago, our parish is working hard to undertake a major capital improvement project--install a new A/C system for our St. Barbara Church, and this system will be able to provide heating, too. Today I would like to share with you the plan for funding this exciting project. The total cost for the project is \$360,000, and we have \$70,000 reserved from our savings for this purpose. After consultation with our PPC and other leaders, we have also decided to use the St. Barbara "To Teach Who Christ Is" fund for this project; it currently has about \$90,000. This fund was originally meant to be used for improving the Parish Center bathrooms and Church roof, but after many years of deferred maintenance and with the recent study of the building by a professional firm, it is clear that it is beyond our financial resources to repair the parish center building. The Church roof was completed in 2016. Keeping in mind the intentions of the responsible stewards who donated to TTWCI towards repairing the Parish Center years ago, today we have to be responsible stewards by using the money for the long-term benefit of our church facility. Attempting to upgrade the parish center to meet today's building requirements would not be good stewardship because that is certain to spiral into everescalating costs for uncertain benefits. So we believe that the most responsible way for our parish to use the TTWCI funds now is to add it to the HVAC project. With these two sources of funding, we have a total of \$160,000 for the project, and then we plan to take out a loan of \$200,000 from the Archdiocese so that we can get this project completed as soon as possible. Meanwhile, we will start a major fundraiser to repay the loan.

The good news is that a few generous donors have pledged \$100,000, in total, for a MATCHING FUND to repay the loan. So now we look to the rest of our parishioners to help raise/donate just half - \$100,000 - of what's needed. I invite you to make a sacrificial gift toward this important effort of improving our historic and beautiful church, with the added bonus of knowing that your donation will be DOUBLED by our generous matching donors. Please make checks payable to St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta Parish with memo: HVAC. Thank you in advance for your generosity!

I will be working with our Finance Council on an appropriate way to acknowledge all donors soon; I will share more with you when I have the information worked out.

WORDS AND ACTIONS by Sr. Caritas

We have many different kinds of relationships in our everyday lives. Whether it is parent and child, husband and wife, friends, or business relationships, what we say and how we say it, or what we do and how we do something, is very important in the relationships. We judge things in our relationships by these words and actions. In our Gospel today, Jesus says that we should "keep my word" and the persons who love Jesus, in turn, Jesus' Father loves that person and God will be intimately close to those persons, living with them daily. Jesus says our words and actions show our love for Him and His Father. For those of us who keep Jesus' word and act in accord of that word, Jesus gives us His peace and leaves that peace with us in our everyday life. He assures us we do not have to be afraid because Jesus and His Father will be with us in all our needs and in each day of our lives.

It is up to each of us to know Jesus' words, to keep His word and to live it out in our everyday lives, then God will send the Holy Spirit to us. This Spirit will guide us and walk with us each day, leading us in Jesus footsteps. If we imitate Jesus in our lives, we will know peace, joy, and will have the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit living in us and with us. We will know deep peace and know God's love for each of us.

JESUS BECOMES OUR FOOD Fr. John Cuff

Last week over a dozen children of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta Parish made their First Holy Communion. Here's one priest's story of how he explained to third-grade Johnny, who was soon to make his First Communion, about what happens and Who it is that we receive at Communion time. The priest relates:

At Johnny's First Communion, I asked him who he loved most in all the world. "My dog!" he replied. "How much do you love your dog? Can you show me?"

Johnny stretched out his arms in the shape of a cross. "That much."

I asked hm to look at Jesus on the large crucifix behind the altar. Jesus had his arms outstretched out too. "Do you love your dog *that* much, Johnny?" I pointed to the crucifix.

Johnny looked up to above his head and nodded, his arms still outstretched.

"If you really love your dog that much, I can tell you how to prove it. Why don't you give up that party after Mass, the hamburgers and the hot dogs and the ice cream? Give up your nice clean bed, your friends, your football. Give up being a little boy. I'll wave a magic wand and you can become a dog! You can live in a kennel and eat bones and dog biscuits. Wouldn't that be great?"

Johnny shook his head, "No! I don't love him that much!" Johnny lowered his arms.

"But Jesus loves you that much. He loves you enough to become a boy, to talk like a boy, to eat like a boy, to play like a boy---and to die like a man. 'Greater love has no man than to lay down his life for his friend.' That cross is the greatest sign of Jesus' love for you as a man. But Jesus is also God, so he can show even greater love than that. If a boy doesn't love his dog enough to become a dog, he certainly doesn't love him enough to become a dog biscuit. The greatest sign of God's love for us is Jesus, who becomes our food."
