Today we observe World Mission Sunday and proclaim in the words of Pope Francis, "everyone has a right to receive the Gospel." In his annual message, the Holy Father reminds us that as baptized Christians, we are duty bound to announce the Gospel without excluding anyone. Through this worldwide Eucharistic celebration, all of us participate in the missionary movement of the Church with our prayers and activities, material offerings, our sufferings and our personal witness.

#### **GIVING BACK TO CAESAR by Fr. John Cuff**

Not long ago, a military dictatorship in Nigeria succeeded in disorganizing the labor unions and the academic elite. The only resistance left was the Church which denounced the dictatorship. The military responded by quoting the passage, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's," accusing the Church of interfering in politics. Didn't the Bible say to give Caesar what is Caesar's---meaning the whole sphere of civil, economic and social affairs---and to God what is God's---meaning the sphere of spiritual affairs? According to this interpretation, human affairs are divided into two spheres: the spiritual side belonging to God and God's ministers, and the secular side belonging to civil authorities. So, does Jesus really teach this dualistic view of human existence?

In today's Gospel, the Pharisees and the Herodians plot together to trap Jesus with the question, "Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" To answer "no" would be to bring arrest by the Romans; to answer "yes" would be to alienate the Jewish people. Either way Jesus was trapped. But His clever reply not only succeeded in confusing His interrogators, but also many who read the Gospel today. Does Jesus mean that we should have two parallel loyalties? But notice the interesting shift in His answer. Their question was whether one should give (Greek didômi) tribute to Caesar. But Jesus' answer speaks of giving back, that is, paying back (paradidômi), as if one already owed something. Thus, instead of answering the question directly of whether one should pay the forced tribute or not, what Jesus is saying can be paraphrased as: "Give back to Caesar what is Caesar's due, and to God what is God's due," thus raising the question to the level of justice, defined by Greek philosophers as, "giving back to everyone what is their due."

What then is Jesus' teaching regarding church-state relations and loyalty to civil authority? He's recommending not absolute but qualified loyalty. That is, if a government provides needed goods and services, then we must in justice give back to the government our loyalty and support. But where a government is a dictatorship imposing itself on the people's will without providing services, the principle of justice does not demand we give it loyalty and support. Thus Christians then must discern whether a given government and its policies merit our loyalty and support. However, total and absolute loyalty and service is a debt that we certainly owe to God and to God alone; it's basically a matter of justice. If God has given us all that we are and have, then we're bound in justice to give back to God gratitude, loyalty and service. Therefore, the central act of Christian worship, called Eucharist, meaning "thanksgiving," is basically a question of paying back the debt of gratitude we owe to God.

#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In 1965 The Second Vatican Council wrote that the "Extreme Unction," which may also and more fittingly be called "Anointing of the Sick" is not a sacrament intended only for those who are at the point of their death...."As soon as any of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, this is already a suitable time for them to receive this sacrament." (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 73)

The Anointing Oil is one of three Chrism Oils that is blessed at the Chrism Mass, and on Holy Thursday the oils are presented to the parish. These oils are then used by the parish throughout the new year.

The Anointing of the Sick sacrament helps unite all those suffering with Jesus. Any baptized Catholic who has reached the age of reason can receive this sacrament if he or she is gravely ill and in danger of death. Many Catholics also request the Anointing of the Sick before major surgery. Elderly Catholics who are experiencing the frailty and health challenges of old age are also welcome to receive the Anointing. The sacrament may be received more than once, even during the same illness if it progresses in seriousness.

Through this sacrament, people receive forgiveness for their sins and comfort in their suffering. They are restored in spirit, and sometimes they even experience the return of physical health. (Site: Loyolapress.com/catholic-resources)



**Baptisms:** Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.


