How Much Do You Know about the Eucharist? Week 4 --- The Concluding Rites



As we continue to celebrate the Year of Parish Eucharistic Revival (June 11, 2023---July 17, 2024), it is a good time to educate ourselves on the meaning behind our liturgy.

Last three Sundays, we reviewed on the Introductory Rites, the Liturgy of the Word, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Today we focus on the Concluding Rites.

The concluding rites begin after communion. It is very short and consists of a final blessing and the dismissal. We have received the gifts

of Christ and are given a final blessing to be nourished and inspired by those gifts. Father then gives the dismissal, where he sends the faithful to "go forth" and be Christ in the world. We are called to take the gifts of the Mass with us forward through the week, carrying the light of Christ for others.

I hope the explanations on the rituals of the Mass have been helpful as we renew our appreciation for the gift of the Eucharist. Let's strive to "actively, consciously, and fully" participate at our Mass, which is rich with symbolism and meaning whenever we worship together.

This Christmas as we receive the ultimate gift that God has given to us---Jesus, our parish also offers you a gift. At all Christmas masses, you are invited to pick up a copy of the book titled, *Beautiful Eucharist*. This is another way to help us to love the Eucharist. Please read it and then share it with family members or another person you think he/she might be interested in.

Finally, I whole heartily invite you and your family and ask you to invite others to join our parish for our Christmas celebration. Merry Christmas!

Ministry of Care: Eucharistic Ministers are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass.

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith.

Weddings: Weddings need to be scheduled at least six months in advance. Couples are reminded to secure the Church date before the reception hall.

THE KING AND THE PAUPER

There's an ancient legend which I think captures the true meaning of Christmas. Long ago, a wise and good king ruled Persia. He loved his people and wanted to know how they lived and their hardships. So he dressed himself up in the clothes of a peasant and went to the homes of the poor. No one he visited suspected that he was their king. One of them was a pauper who lived in a cellar. The king ate his coarse food with him and cheered him up. Then he left. Later he visited the poor man again and disclosed his identity. The king thought the man would surely ask for some gift or favor, but he didn't. Instead he said, "You left your palace and your glory to visit me in this dark, dreary place. You ate the coarse food I ate. You brought gladness to my heart! To others you may have given rich gifts. But to me you have given yourself!"

At Christmas we celebrate the King of Kings leaving his divine glory and coming to our dreary world to share with us our poverty, misery, and pain. It is not a question of Jesus bringing us any particular gift or blessing, it is a question of Him giving us Himself. This is the big difference between Jesus and Santa Claus. Santa Claus rides in an open sleigh giving gifts to children who have been good, so long as their houses have chimneys. Santa leaves the gifts under the Christmas tree and then disappears. Christ, on the other hand, does not leave a gift and disappear. He continues to live with us. He comes to share our human condition. His very presence is the gift. And as the poor man in our story knows, being with the king is a far more satisfying than receiving a gift from him.

When we speak of the eternal Son of God leaving his heavenly glory, taking on flesh and becoming a human being like us in all things except sin, we use the word "incarnation." This is the mystery that we celebrate at Christmas, of how the eternal Word of God took flesh in a little child of Bethlehem. Today we find ourselves in the same position as that pauper being visited by his king. Like the poor man, our hearts should be full of joy today, not because of any extra gifts the king will give us, but even more so, because of the fact that our King has come to be with us, to become one of us. What greater gift could we receive this Christmas? Move over, Santa Claus, our newborn King is here. Merry Christmas!

Beyond the Envelope Series Week 4: Free Ways to Support SMTCP

So far we've talked about online giving, special giving with tax incentives, and increasing our weekly donation amounts, but we understand these are not for everyone – but there IS still something you can do to boost the parish's finances!

- Sign up for your Employer's Matching Program Ask your employer if it has a program that will match (and sometimes even triple) employee donations to charity.
- Bring a friend to mass you'd be spreading the good news, too! If you know someone searching for a new spiritual home or school, or those seeking weddings, baptisms, or other sacraments, encourage them to consider SMTCP.
- Tell friends and family about why you love SMTCP, and invite them to contribute to our fundraising events, including the Super Duper Bowl coming up in February, the Carnival in May, our booth at the Chinatown Summer Fair, and the Walkathon in October.
- Sell weekly bulletin ad space the bulletin ads are one of our major fundraisers for the year. Do you know any business owners who would like the exposure? See the parish office for a bulletin ad sales form.
- Provide goods and services as in-kind support. Do you have a skill that can be offered to the parish to reduce our bills? Perhaps you are handy with building maintenance, repairs, or cleaning, or maybe you own a restaurant or supplies business and can donate catering services and materials. Can you provide music at our masses or supplies for our booth at the Chinatown Summer Fair? Donating these in-kind gifts help to reduce or even eliminate parish expenses and are typically tax-deductible.
- Arrange for discounts and donations from businesses the parish uses, such as local neighborhood restaurants or supplies stores.
- Reduce usage anywhere you can every little bit helps! Examples include making sure doors are shut to reduce loss of heat or air conditioning, turning off lights and equipment when not in use, returning the bulletin after reading if you will not be sharing it, reducing the amount of disposable goods used at parish receptions, or bringing your own water to parish events. This is also in support of our Christian call to care for creation.
