# Preparing for The Mass and Holy Communion as a family

In the Mass, we come together as the People of God to worship with one heart, one mind and one voice. We are always invited to encounter Jesus in the Mass. He is present in the priest who presides at Mass, in the Word of God proclaimed and in the assembly gathered to worship. But the most special way we encounter Jesus at Mass is in the Eucharist—his sacramental presence under the signs of bread and wine. The bread and wine offered to God the Father through the priest are completely transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. We experience this encounter with Jesus most powerfully when we receive the Eucharist in Holy Communion.

#### Step 1: Scripture and Prayer

- Start by setting up a prayer space in your home. Here's a guide to help you get started with praying as a family.
- · Pray this Family Prayer as you begin.
- Read the Story of the Last Supper in the Gospel of Matthew 26:26-28 together.

#### Step 3: Videos and Craft Activities

- Watch a Gospel reflection video from My Catholic Kids about the Road to Emmaus.
- Watch "What Happens to the Bread & Wine?" from C4: Ignite Your Faith.
- Learn about the Making of the Communion Wafers in a Passionist Monastery.
- Color this quote about the Eucharist and hang it in your home.
- Look at a Leonardo da Vinci's painting of the Last Supper and draw your own or print this coloring page.
- Learn about the Mass with the Introduction to Mass Story and Reflection and the 4 Parts of the Catholic Mass for Kids article.

#### Step 2: Reflecting on the Gospel Reading

Talk about the Gospel reading together—what stood out to you? Here are some other questions to consider:

- Who was at the Last Supper? (Jesus and his disciples)
- What did Jesus do with the bread? (took it, said the blessing, broke it, gave it)
- What did Jesus tell the disciples to do? (take and eat)
- Who goes to Mass? (believers in Jesus)
- What does the priest do with the bread at Mass? (takes it, says the blessing, breaks it, gives it)
- Who do we receive in Holy Communion? (Jesus)

#### Step 4: Sharing

- Reflect on the fact that when you receive Holy Communion, you receive the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. What does this mean to you?
- The dismissal at mass tell us to "Go forth," or to go out and spread the Gospel. Talk about what the mission of spreading the Gospel might look like in your daily life.
- Discuss ways that you might prepare for Sunday mass as a family each week.
- End your reflection on the Mass and the Eucharist by praying the Our Father Prayer together.

## **BE NOT AFRAID by Fr. Cuff**

In today's Gospel Christ tells his Apostles over and over again not to fear. "Fear no one," he says, "Do not be afraid of those who can kill the body but not the soul." These words recall an incident that happened in Russia during the last century when the Communist Party was still in power. It happened during the state funeral in 1982 of former Communist Leonid Brezhnev, which was being televised all over Russia. With solemn funeral music playing, Brezhnev's body lay in state while party leaders filed by to pay their last respects. Nearby his widow, Mrs. Brezhnev, with her head down sat motionless next to the coffin until seconds before it was closed. Just as the soldiers were about to place the lid on the coffin, Mrs. Brezhnev stood up, and before the eyes of millions of television viewers, reached down and made a large sign of the cross on her husband's chest. Party leaders and funeral guests were stunned, because right there in the world center of atheistic power, this courageous gesture of this simple woman gave witness to her faith that her husband might still be saved. She hoped that the same Jesus whom her husband had fought against all his life might yet have mercy on his soul. It must have taken a lot of courage in those days for Mrs. Brezhnev to publicly acknowledge her faith before the world, and it had to be a great embarrassment for the atheistic Communist leaders.

Mrs. Brezhnev was not afraid to acknowledge her faith because she believed what Christ tells us in today's Gospel: "Do not fear those who kill the body but not the soul." But how often do we in our daily lives hesitate to speak the Christ-like word or do the Christ-like thing because we fear the smirks and sneers of others, or being called a goodie-goodie, or of people making fun of us? How many of us would be willing to risk our job or a promotion rather than deny our faith in Christ; how many would be willing to say no to our colleagues or friends who suggest something impure or dishonest? Moreover, when the Church that Christ founded is unjustly attacked, when Christ's teachings are ridiculed, how many of us will not be afraid to speak up for our faith? Let's remember what Christ promises us today: "Everyone who acknowledges me before men, I will also acknowledge before my Father in Heaven." But on the other hand, let's remember that He also says that if we deny Him, He will deny us.

Great joy is found when one offers his/her life in service to God's call.


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
