

## What was it like to know St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta?

The movie "Mother Teresa: No Greater Love" offers a welcome insider's view to that question.

The film is a reminder of the unique nature of our parish patron. During her life in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century Mother Teresa was captured in news stories, on film, and in personal encounters. This movie uses those resources to tell a compelling story – simultaneously joyful, inspiring, and challenging.

To complete the narrative, the film also supplements the documentary footage with reenactments of private moments, especially early in her life, when there was no film footage. Through it all you will see first-hand how Mother Teresa treated every life as precious, and every moment as a gift.

"Mother Teresa: No Greater Love" was first released in 2022, produced and promoted internationally by the Knights of Columbus.

Last year our Knights Council 2428 and our parish held a movie night at a north side commercial theater. Now, the story of Mother Teresa is coming home here to our parish. You are invited to our own movie night at the St. Barbara Gym on Saturday, March 4, following the 5 pm mass.

## What Evangelization looks like in this Lent for You?

This Lent, what are you doing for your spiritual life and for others? How about Evangelization?

Pope Francis in one of his recent sharing titled, "**The passion of evangelizing, apostolic zeal,**" says, "evangelizing is not saying, 'Look, blah, blah' and nothing more. There is a passion that involves everything in our lives; the mind, the heart, the hands, going out…!" I was very inspired by Pope Francis' article. This reflection is based on his wisdom.

Lent season is a perfect time for us all to walk with Jesus and to encounter our Lord. I also see great opportunities to evangelize, to bring our Lord Jesus with joy and confidence to others. Remember, you don't have to think that you have to learn in an academy or being an ordained minister to be a great evangelizer. No, no! It is not how many books, how much school you have gone through or whether you are ordained or not, it is most importantly about the encounter with the Lord, and the passion to share the Lord with others. Witnessing Him, in fact, be staying with Him in the Light so you can shine and bright. If we do not receive His light, we will be extinguished. Thus, only the person who remains with Him can bring the Gospel of Jesus. Have we received the gift yet? This is the reason for the proclamation. Going forth and bringing the joy of what we have received.

We may wonder, what, then, to proclaim? Jesus says: "Preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" (v. 7). Do you hear the voice of our Lord that speaks to you? How often do we forget or never think about God is near: God's closeness, mercy, and tenderness. How many of us really give primacy to the Lord, the very first place to Him, and most of all, to give to others the opportunities to welcome Him, to realize that He is near, He is merciful, and He is tender.

"Just go tell others the Kingdom is at hand". What are we waiting for, go, and stay! Let evangelization begin in this Lenten season. Do I have a desire to proclaim the good news? How? Where? When? How many of you have noticed the poster in our churches stating, "Evangelization Starts at Home"? Yes, we have to share the Good News with our family members who are not practicing faith or who don't believe in Jesus yet. We have to share this amazing faith we have with people in Bridgeport and Chinatown and beyond.

## THE FIRST AND THE SECOND ADAMS by Fr. Cuff

Today's second reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans, speaks of two men who, more than anyone else, influenced the history of our salvation. The first is Adam, through whom sin and death came into the world, and mankind fell from God's favor. The other is Jesus, through whom mankind once more reconciled to God, and grace and eternal life are restored to us: "For just as by one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience the many will be made righteous."

In Jewish belief, one person can act in the name of a whole group of people in such a way that the fate and destiny of that group hangs on the success or failure of that one person. This belief is seen in the famous story of David and Goliath, where we see how the war between two nations, the Israelites and the Philistines, was settled by one-on-one combat between David and Goliath. David won, and so the Israelites were victorious; Goliath lost, and so the entire nation of the Philistines was defeated. In a similar way, Paul argues that all mankind stood condemned on account of Adam's disobedience and that all mankind stands justified before God on account of Christ's obedience.

But even so, there's a big difference between our sharing in Adam's loss and our sharing in Christ's merits. Original sin is our genetic inheritance from Adam. Since Adam is the father of all mankind, it can be said that all mankind was literally in Adam's loins. Adam's DNA is stamped in the DNA of all humanity. But we cannot say the same about Christ. His DNA has not been passed down to all humanity. Thus our belonging to Adam is by nature; we've no choice in the matter. Our belonging to Christ is by choice. That's why all humankind inherits Adam's fallen human nature, whether we like it or not. But it is only those who choose to belong to Christ who will inherit the blessings He has won for humanity. Lent then is when the Church reminds us of what Christ has done for us, and invites us all to make a conscious decision to belong to Him. As St. Paul says, "We entreat you on behalf of Christ be reconciled to God....Now is the acceptable time; now is the day of salvation!" So this lent

let's actively choose to belong to Christ!

## Lenten Regulations (from Feb. 22nd, 2023, Ash Wednesday--- the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.
