Asian Community Celebration!

This Sunday, our parish is joyfully hosting the 5th Annual Asian Catholic Initiative Gathering and Mass for our Archdiocese. **Bishop Robert Lombardo** will lead the Eucharistic adoration that begins at **3pm; Cardinal Blase Cupich** will preside over the Mass that begins at **4pm.**

The Mass will show our diversity in unity. Various Marian statues and icons from different Asian communities will be on display in front of the Sacred Heart Altar. Prayers of the Faithful will be offered in Filipino, Vietnamese, Korean, Japanese, Chinese and Indonesian languages. Five different choirs will sing in their native Filipino, Vietnamese, Chinese, Indonesian and English languages. Guests are encouraged to wear their native attire. There will be a reception after mass in the Lower Hall, Gym and St. Mother Teresa Hall.

OWNER AND BUILDER by Fr. John Cuff

John XXIII was Pope during the turbulent 1960s when it seemed that everything in the Church was falling apart, the priesthood, religious life, marriage, even the Church itself seemed to be in crisis. Pope John worked long and hard hours trying to address these problems. One evening, after a particularly exhausting day, he went to his private chapel for his daily Holy Hour before retiring, but was too exhausted and too stressed out to pray. After a few minutes of futile effort, he got up and said, "Lord, the Church belongs to you; it's your Church. I'm going to bed." Yes, difficulties may have driven the Pope to acknowledge that the Church belongs to Christ. But Jesus Himself said that 2000 years ago, when He said: "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of Hell will not prevail against it." This passage is crucial for a proper understanding of what the Church is and our role in the Church, for it's the most explicit statement that Jesus ever made in the Gospels about His Church.

Firstly, it tells us that Jesus is the owner of the Church. Neither Peter nor the disciples own the Church. Pastors and Church leaders who think and act as if they own the Church are like farm workers who go about posing as if the farm belongs to them. All God's people have been called together as co-workers in Christ's vineyard, although some work as foremen overseeing others. But we do not own the Church; we belong to the Church. The owner of the Church is Christ. Secondly, the passage tells us that Jesus is the one who builds his Church. He's the master builder who has the building plan in his hands. We human cooperators are like masons and carpenters employed by the master builder to help him with the building. Our role is to listen and follow his instructions, doing our own small part in the grand design of the master. Workers who follow their own ideas of what the building should be, rather than follow the plan given by the master, may find themselves working at cross purposes with the master, which, depending on how much damage they cause, might get them "fired."

If Jesus is the owner and builder of the Church, where then do we come in? Precisely where Peter comes in. Together with Peter we're the building blocks of the Church. Peter is the foundation rock and we are the pieces of stones with which the Church is built: "Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." (1 Peter 2:5). The passive voice "let yourselves be built" indicates that God Himself is the builder and not us. Our role is to allow God to use us. The questions we could ask ourselves today is: "How is God using me to build up His Church?" "Am I letting Him use me?" Let's not forget that, no matter how small a stone may be, the master builder can still use it to build something beautiful.
