# A note from Sabina Lilly—Music Director

In November of 2022 I began experiencing frequent and severe pain in an area by my right vocal cord and in the surrounding structures. A throat scope revealed damage to my vocal folds. After working with a team of Western medical specialists, voice therapists, bodywork experts, and with alternative practitioners, we have determined that the best course of action to alleviate pain and to prevent further damage is for me to control how and when I use my singing and speaking voice.

Unfortunately, the combination of teaching classroom music and leading the Parish music program has proven too physically taxing on my voice. I do not see a solution where I can perform the job of Music Director/ Music Teacher as expected and have a healthy and fruitful future as a singer. I regret to inform you that I will not be returning to St. Therese School next year, and that I will be transitioning out of the Music Director role in the months to come.

### **OUR GOD-GIVEN GIFTS by Fr. Cuff**

There's an old story about a certain Fr. Stan whose day off was Friday. One Friday during Lent he decided to go hunting. In tramping through the woods, he encountered a bear. They both saw each other at the same time. The bear began coming toward him. Fr. Stan lifted his gun and took aim. However, his gun jammed and before he knew it the bear was on top of him. He prayed: "God, save me! Make this bear a Christian. Better yet, make him a Catholic. Surely a good Catholic bear wouldn't eat meat on a Lenten Friday." Suddenly the bear fell to its knees and started praying. The priest was so grateful until he heard what the bear was saying as he prayed: "Bless us Oh Lord and these thy gifts..."

This story is a round-about way to introduce today's Pentecostal theme of "God-given gifts." Indeed, the greatest gift that God gives His Church is the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost we also celebrate the many gifts that the Holy Spirit Himself brings with Him. They are divided into two kinds, the seven-fold gifts and the "charismatic gifts." First of all, the seven-fold gifts of the Spirit help a person to grow in personal holiness; they make us more sensitive to receive and carry out his inspirations. These are Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Counsel, Courage, Piety, and Fear of the Lord, the ones received in the Sacrament of Confirmation. They help us to appreciate our faith more deeply and to love God more ardently.

The second kind of gifts of the Spirit are the so-called "charismatic gifts." These are not given for ourselves personally; rather they are given to help "build up the Church," especially one's parish. The more extraordinary of these are prophecy, healing, and the gift of "tongues." Then there are the more common forms of service, like financial and maintenance expertise, plus teaching others the faith, cheering the sick, and sharing one's talents for the enrichment of the parish. And let's not forget the ordinary, unnoticed, behind-the-scenes gifts, which are essential to the running of a parish. St. Paul tells us we must never despise these lesser gifts. Without these lesser ministries, surely the greater ministries might never happen. What is your gift? When people are involved in their parish, you can be sure the Holy Spirit is present and at work in them. Happy Pentecost!

#### **PENTECOST by Sr. Caritas**

Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. It is one of the great feasts of the Church year. It is as important as Christmas or Easter. Pentecost celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles as they prayed in the "Upper Room" in Jerusalem waiting for the Spirit's coming. As the Gospel tells us, they were there, fearful that they too would be taken by the Jews and killed as Jesus was. Jesus had told the Apostles to go to Jerusalem to the room and pray and wait "for the coming of the Spirit." They were praying and hiding.

When the Holy Spirit comes to them, we immediately see two gifts the Spirit gives. Peter and the other apostles stop hiding and are no longer afraid. The second gift is Peter preaches to the people and three thousand people are baptized and added to the community of believers that day. With the "fullness of the Spirit" filling their lives, the Apostles begin their public ministry.

**Ministry of Care:** Eucharistic Ministers are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass.
