Synod 2021-2023

Pope Francis has called a Synod for October, 2023 and titled it, **For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission.**

Yes, it has been described as a "synod on synodality." Whatever you call it, this is a worldwide outreach to ask every-day people about their journey with the Lord. The objective is to listen, as the entire People of God, to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. "In fact, the whole Synod process aims at fostering a lived experience of discernment, participation, and co-responsibility." (Vademecum 1.3)

The Secretariat of the Synod is asking each diocese to condense the fruit of their reflections into a maximum of ten pages. The goal is not to produce documents, but "plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, and allow hope to flourish ..." (see Synod preparatory documents and Holy Father's keynote address to first plenary session of the synod).

On the weekend of October 9-10, 2021, Pope Francis officially began the Synod process; the Archdiocese of Chicago officially began the local process on Sunday, October 24. We recently received word that Cardinal Cupich has until June 30, 2022 to submit reflections from the archdiocese. This is two more months than originally planned, which allows us to invite all the parishes of the archdiocese to participate. The national statement is due at the Synod Office in Rome on August 15, 2022.

A parish workbook has been prepared to invite conversation, reflection, and dreaming; it is an instrument to focus parishioners' thoughts and provides a way to compile and include reflections from our parish as part of the archdiocesan input for the Synod. THE SECOND COMING by Fr. John Cuff

A certain man, Herbert, was so taken up with the notion of Christ's second coming and the imminence of the rapture that he became a pain in the neck to his coworkers. So they hatched a plan to get even with him. One day when he went to the bathroom, they laid their work clothes on their chairs and hid in the supply room. When Herbert returned, he thought the rapture had taken place. The Muslim janitor, who was part of the joke, pretended to have witnessed everyone disappear and ran around the office feigning panic. Herbert fell to his knees clutching his heart and screamed, "I knew you'd forget me, Jesus! Where did I go wrong?" He was rushed to a local hospital with a heart attack, and after undergoing bypass surgery was released. "We didn't mean to scare him to death," said his coworkers apologetically. "We just wanted to teach him a lesson."

Like Herbert, the Thessalonians to whom Paul wrote were obsessed with the nearness of the second coming of Christ. In today's reading, Paul reprimands them for giving up work and living in idleness. Apparently, some of them thought that the Lord's coming was so near that there was no point in providing for the future. This allowed Paul's unbelieving opponents to say that Christ's "second coming" was all a ruse fabricated by Paul to scare people into accepting the faith. They pointed out that some of the first Christians who had thought that Jesus would return to take them with him had already died, and thus they had been deluded in their belief. Paul's response was that the deaths of those believers did not mean that they would suffer any disadvantage, but that at Christ's coming, they the dead too will also rise, together with the living, to meet the Lord in mid-air.

If it was problematic for the early Christians to believe in the second coming of Christ because some of them had already died, it can be even more problematic for today's Christians, since centuries have passed since Paul's time and we've yet to see Jesus coming upon the clouds. In fact Paul himself believed that he would be one of those still living when the Lord returned. No wonder, then, that just the opposite to Herbert, many Christians today do not take belief in the second coming of Christ seriously, and thus neglect to prepare for it, for example, by going to confession. In doing so they throw out the baby with the bath water. Yet the bottom line of the Church's faith concerning the second coming of Christ is that "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead." The best way to prepare for the second coming of Christ is not to engage in speculations of how or when or where it will happen. Rather, as Paul says, to use the time to "increase and abound in love" for one another and for all" so that we "may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints."
