

HAPPINESS AND THE BEATITUDES Fr. Cuff

"Happiness is that which all men seek," said Aristotle, and that everything we do, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, is what we think will bring us happiness in some form or another. But what we think brings happiness doesn't always in fact bring true and lasting happiness. Example: the drunkard who believes happiness is found in a beer bottle. One bottle too many and he runs a red light, hits a car, and wakes up the next morning in a hospital with stiches all over his body. Then he realizes that the happiness promised by alcohol may be too short-lived. Or the man who frequents the casino. Soon his bank account is in the red and he can no longer pay his rent, then it dawns on him that the happiness promised by the casino is illusory. Thus Aristotle says that the ethical man is he who knows and does what can truly bring him not just excitement or pleasure, but true and lasting happiness.

Another word for this happiness is "beatitude." In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus promises his followers true and lasting happiness that the world cannot give, a kind of blessedness that He calls being in the "kingdom of God/heaven." The eight beatitudes we have in today's Gospel constitute a road map for anyone seeking to attain the happiness of this kingdom. However, while we all seek happiness, we often look for it in the wrong places. Ask people around you what makes people happy and compare their answers with the answers Jesus gives. In fact, if a committee were set up to draw up the beatitudes, we'd probably end up with a list very different from that which Jesus gives us today: Where Jesus says, "Blessed are the poor in spirit," they may say, "Blessed are the rich." Where Jesus says, "Blessed are those who mourn," they say, "Blessed those having fun." Where Jesus says, "Blessed are the meek, they might say, ""Blessed are the clever." Where Jesus says, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice," they might say, "Blessed are they who wine and dine."

Where Jesus says, "Blessed are the merciful," they might say "Blessed are the powerful." Where Jesus says, "Blessed are the pure of heart," they might say, "Blessed are the sexy."

Where Jesus says, "Blessed are the peacemakers," they might say "Blessed are the news makers." And where Jesus says, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for right-eousness sake," they might say, "Blessed are those who can afford the best lawyers."

Yes, the values preached by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount are unmistakably counter-cultural. So ask yourself: Do you live your life following the values of this world as a way of attaining happiness, or do you live by the teachings of Jesus? If you live by the teachings of Jesus, then rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven.

Please contact parish office for any of the following:


Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.


