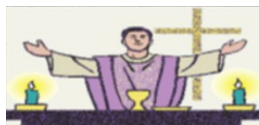

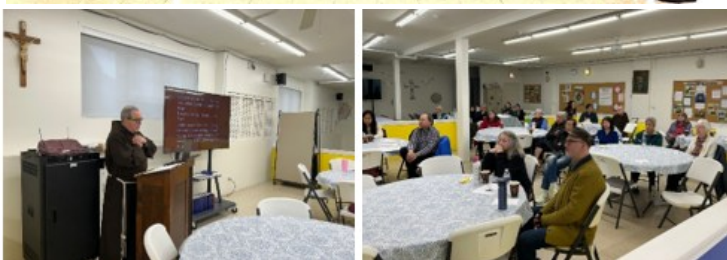

WAVING OF PALM BRANCHES

Several years ago the world witnessed the jubilant reaction of the people of Iraq at the fall of the Hassan regime. Their dictator Saddam Hussein was toppled after a quick war called

Desert Storm. The TV carried images of the victorious allied forces rolling into Baghdad, with the crowds celebrating by waving palm branches to welcome the victors.

This ancient mid-eastern form of expressing joy survives even to the present day. However, within a few short days, that joy was replaced by looting and anarchy. Things soon descended into chaos. The waving of palm branches had been merely an emotional expression. Many Iraqis were not then, nor are many still now, ready to commit to a more stable way of life. That demands personal sacrifice on their part.

The people who greeted Jesus as He entered Jerusalem riding on a donkey also made an emotional statement of joy. Waving palm branches, they welcomed the Messiah, the deliverer from their enemies, but they were not ready to commit to His new way of life. They wanted a Messiah whom they could cheer, and not one who would say, "Follow me," and then die on a cross. They wanted to cheer a liberator, but not to take part in the ultimate liberation He offered, freedom from sin.

We must be careful that our reaction to what takes place during Holy Week does not follow the same course. Following Jesus during His final hours demands a transformation of our lives by His life. As the Lenten custom of receiving ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday symbolize the sentence of death we are all under, so too should the blessed palms that we wave on Palm Sunday remind us of the life and victory Christ offers us through the Cross. In both of these customs let's not simply go through the motions, but may they signify a real change in our lives. As we begin this holiest of weeks, let us not be satisfied with waving palms. Rather let us accompany Christ at the Last Supper, the Agony in the Garden, and the Way of the Cross. And let us not turn against Jesus as did the fickle people of Jerusalem, but rather let us cheer on His victory and remain His faithful followers throughout this coming Holy Week and our entire lives.

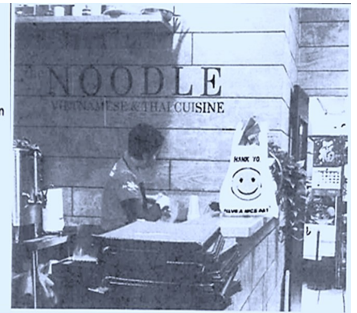

Final Preaching Survey for Fr. Li

Two years ago, Fr. Li was nominated by the Archdiocese of Chicago to participate in the Preaching for Encountering program, which is from the Institute of Homiletics at the University of Dallas.

During this 2-year period, the preachers (priests, deacons, bishop) met monthly and attended retreats twice annually. They would study homiletics in large- and small-group gatherings of preachers, and received personal coaching.

For each preacher, a group of lay volunteers who would support him and pray for him as he worked to grow in his preaching. The group was called ST. JOSEPH'S PREACHERS (SJP) under the patronage of Jesus's foster father, that quiet patron of workers.

Here at our Parish, SJP consisted of 10 volunteers: Carl DiFranco, Jim Keating, John Lin, Kimberly Casey, Mina Tse, Nicole Orendain, Pam Spano, Rose Lau, Simone Orendain and Perry Lau as the coordinator. We served as the connector of pulpit and pew.

In Year 1, our group would meet monthly without Fr. Li. We studied workbook that would give insights into what effective preaching looked like, how to give feedback to him, and how to listen for the presence of God in the liturgy and in scripture.

In Year 2, our monthly meetings were joined by Fr. Li. We discussed questions on the workbook, gave feedback on Fr. Li's homily, studied the scriptures for the upcoming Sunday and shared our ideas that Fr. Li could incorporate in his preparation of the homily.

As this pilot program concluded recently, a FINAL PARISH PREACHING SURVEY will be conducted to allow parishioners to rate and offer feedback on Fr. Li's homily. The survey can help Fr. Li and the program in the future.
