

OUR HIGH PRIEST'S ASCENSION Fr. John Cuff

Little Amy urgently needed a blood transfusion. Her kid brother, Jimmy, had had the same disease two years ago and had recovered. Since her best chance of recovery was a transfusion from someone who had recovered from the disease, Jimmy was identified as the ideal donor. "Would you be willing to give your blood to Amy?" asked the doctor. Jimmy hesitated; his lower lip began to tremble. At last he smiled and said, "Sure, for my sister." Soon the two kids were wheeled into the hospital room. Neither spoke, but when their eyes met, Jimmy grinned. As the nurse inserted the needle into his arm, Jimmy's smile faded. He watched his blood flow through the tube. When the ordeal was over, Jimmy's shaky voice broke the silence. "Doctor, when do I die?" It was only then the doctor realized why he had hesitated, why his lip had trembled. Jimmy thought giving his blood to his sister meant giving his life so she might live. Fortunately, he didn't have to die.

Blood was central to temple worship in Jerusalem. Much of temple priest's work involved slaughtering animals and shedding their blood to atone for sin, then sprinkling the people with the blood to cleanse them from guilt. As the author of Hebrews explains, "Under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood, there is no forgiveness of sins." Thus, in the people's dealings with God, the most important personage was not the king, nor the prophet, but the priest who offered the sacrifice of blood that took away the sins of the people and restored them to God's favor. Although He did not identify Himself nor His apostles as priests, by the time Hebrews was written, Jewish Christians had come to see Jesus as the eternal High Priest par excellence, and compared to Jesus' priesthood, the temple priesthood was only a shadow.

The Ascension of Christ into heaven is therefore also compared to the temple priest going up the steps into the sanctuary to offer sacrifice. But the sacrifice of Christ is infinitely superior. The temple priest offered the blood of lambs, but the blood of the Son of God is infinitely more powerful than the blood of lambs to take away our sins. Today, as we celebrate the ascension of the Lord into heaven, let us not mourn the disappearance of Christ. Rather let us celebrate his going up into the eternal holy place, into God's very presence, to make atonement for us.

Statement of Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, archbishop of Chicago, on the massacre of children in Uvalde, Texas

Today, a gunman walked into a grade school in Uvalde, TX, and slaughtered at least 18 children. The shooter allegedly killed his grandmother before driving to the school. Authorities say the suspect is dead. He was 18 years old.

The parents were told, "Please do not pick up students at this time. Students need to be accounted for before they are released to your care." Imagine being a parent with a child in that school. Imagine having to bury them.

Parents now face a delay in identifying the victims—such was the extent of the damage done to these children's bodies by the killer's weapons.

As I reflect on this latest American massacre, I keep returning to the questions: Who are we as a nation if we do not act to protect our children? What do we love more: our instruments of death or our future?

The Second Amendment did not come down from Sinai. The right to bear arms will never be more important than human life. Our children have rights too. And our elected officials have a moral duty to protect them.
