

Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.



EVANGELIZING LORI: ALL SAINTS' DAY by Roberta Cheong



I attended Mass last year on All Saints' Day to honor the saints and because it is a holy day of obligation. My nursing home roommate Lori, who is Lutheran, asked me why I went to church on a Tuesday. That question launched an entire week of the most intense conversations about religion between us. She had copious questions, and I spent the whole week catechizing her on Original Sin, Baptism, Confession, salvation, Judgment, Heaven, Hell, Purgatory, the saints, the Last Rites, etc. She said, "I'm not a practicing Lutheran. I only know the basics." But even the concept of Original Sin was difficult for her to understand, and I needed to explain it many times in different ways until she got it.

On All Saints' Day, I taught Lori about how everyone in Heaven is a saint, but some of them are also canonized saints on Earth. I explained the formal pro-

cess of how one becomes a canonized saint in the Catholic Church and the title they are given at each step on the way to sainthood, i.e. first "Venerable," then "Blessed," then "Saint." I explained how a major miracle needs to be attributed to the intercession of that candidate in order to advance to the next step toward sainthood (so two miracles total) and how the Catholic Church is very meticulous in determining whether something counts as a miracle.

The next day (All Souls' Day), I told Lori, "Today is one of the top 3 days when the largest number of souls leave Purgatory and go to Heaven. Another one of these days is on Christmas... It's like they 'graduate' today into Heaven." This was the first time she had ever learned about Purgatory, so she had a myriad of questions, and we talked until 3 am. Fr. Mike Schmitz once said, "The more seriously a person takes their faith, the more often they have questions." I taught Lori about what the purpose of Purgatory is, why a soul would go there, how a soul is able to leave Purgatory, and the importance of praying for the dead. She asked me, "So then, no one goes straight to Heaven after they die?" I answered, "No, some people do. Martyrs, for example, who died as a result of being persecuted for their faith in Jesus Christ do."

I taught her how the Last Rites are like 3 sacraments in one (Anointing of the Sick, Communion, and Confession) and what happens during Last Rites, which I personally received when I nearly died multiple times during my 10 years of kidney disease. Angrily, she asked me, "So my dad can receive his Last Rites in the hour before he dies and could go straight to Heaven, but my mom—who was a way better person than my dad—might have to suffer in Purgatory first?" I replied, "That just shows we can't earn our way into Heaven. It's based on God's mercy. Even a murderer can get into Heaven. There needs to be real repentance, though. We believe that God is just *and* merciful. I know you want justice for the way your father treated you, but instead of that, why not be more loving and desire mercy for your father? God would not put someone in Purgatory if He didn't think they needed to be there. Like when Jesus was crucified on the cross, there were two other people who were crucified with Him. One of them believed in Jesus in the last moment of his life and repented. Then Jesus said to him, 'Today you will be with me in Heaven' even though he had lived a life of sin. Whereas the other man didn't believe and repent."

I told Lori, "Purgatory is a gift from God. It's like a spiritual shower. The people who are in Purgatory want to be there." She exclaimed, "What?! Nobody wants to suffer!" The next day, I explained further and said, "Yesterday, I said that the people in Purgatory are glad that they are there and want to be there. I said that not because they have to suffer, but because the purification, perfection in holiness, and virtues they receive there FAR outweighs any of their sufferings. It's not even comparable. **The suffering we endure is so temporary, but the trade-off is so much greater.** They know that when they leave there, they get to go to Heaven, and they will be pure and perfect in holiness. Like, I feel like I'm going through Purgatory on Earth—throwing up every day and having dialysis—but I'm SO HAPPY, because through my physical sufferings, I am growing closer to God and becoming a better person. Think of how short life is compared to an eternity in Heaven. It's like a drop of water in the ocean."

After everything I taught her about Catholicism, the one thing she wrestled with the most was the concept of Purgatory, so I sent her 6 videos of Catholic priests explaining Purgatory, Confession, and suffering and illness much better than I could. To my surprise, she actually watched the videos, but remained offended by the ideas of Purgatory, Last Rites, and Confession after watching them. Ultimately, I said, "Even if you don't like the idea of it, Purgatory exists."
