HOLY WEEK

As we journey through the most Holy Week of our liturgical year, I encourage you and your families to join our Triduum celebrations: Holy Thursday---the gifts of the Eucharist and of priesthood; Good Friday---the Way of the Cross and the veneration of the Cross; Easter Vigil and Easter---the Sacraments of initiation and the resurrection of our Lord. The celebration of the Paschal mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection starts on Holy Thursday and completes on Easter. The detailed schedule for these celebrations is listed below for your convenience.

Palm Sunday Weekend – April 1-2

- B. Palms will be distributed and blessed at the beginning of each mass at the Church entrance area and then a short procession will take place in Church. Detailed instructions will be offered at mass.

LITTLE JOHNNY AND THE CRUCIFIX by Fr. Cuff

Little Johnny, a terror in the classroom, was failing all his exams in the public school until his parents decided to send him to a Catholic school. At the end of the year Johnny came out on top of the class, and his parents asked him why the great change? Johnny replied, "You see, the moment I walked into that Catholic school and saw that man hanging on the cross, I knew that those people meant business; so I decided not to take any chances." Assuming the story is true, Johnny's improvement in school is to be commended, but it's clear that has totally misunderstood the meaning of the crucifix. The man on the cross is not there to scare little boys, but to show them how much He loves them. He's not there to show them what would happen to them if they misbehave; He's there to show them that He's already paid the penalty for their sins. He's not dying on saying weekend masses for us when he is healthy. He is the cross for what He has done, but for what you and I

have done. Because He loves us, He died in our place and He died for us out of love.

"He died for us:" Perhaps we've heard this phrase so often that it now carries with it neither the shock of someone dying for what we have done, nor the good news of our being delivered from death. That's why the Church displays crucifixes rather than simply crossesto remind us of the extent of Christ's great love for mankind, so much so that He was willing to die in our place. In fact, to emphasize this point, it's helpful to notice that in the old liturgy before Vatican II, the reading of the Passion was greeted with total silence. There was no homily after the reading of the Passion on Palm Sunday; even the concluding acclamation, "And this is the Gospel of the Lord," was omitted. Perhaps the Church felt that the most eloquent response to the Passion story that we had just heard proclaimed was silence, and that even the best of homilies could be a distraction from the deep meditation into which we should enter after hearing the account of the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. In any event, after Vatican II, the Church now allows a short homily to focus our meditation in the right spirit, maybe so that people don't get the wrong idea like little Johnny did. What God expects from us today, Palm Sunday, when seeing and hearing the profound love that His Son has for us by dying on the cross, is gratitude – gratitude deep enough to make us hate sin of every kind, and strong enough to make us translate our love of Jesus into love for one another during this Holy Week.

UPDATE: Fr. Tony is doing much better, and he is back home from the hospital. His doctor told him to totally rest for the next 4 to 6 weeks. Hopefully he will be back grateful for your prayers and care!

It was the spring of 2019, when I first met Father Li. I was searching for a church open during the pandemic. I had just attended a funeral mass and I asked Father Li when his church would open to the public. He whispered to me that he was going to open his doors in early June, but don't say anything. I waited several Sundays and

finally found the church doors open. I have not looked back since.

I am now involved with the weekly rosary group

on Mondays and have never felt better in my life. Father Li has me carry the Cross with Jesus to lead our group through Chinatown and pray. I feel so inspired with the Cross: at times I am overwhelmed with emotion, just realizing Jesus is with our group. I would strongly recommend some form of prayer daily. We all carry some cross in our lives, but I am fortunate to carry the Cross with Jesus.


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.


