What Matters to God

Today's readings speak about "vanity" and the danger of being "rich." It's human nature to be greedy. This is why greed is one of the 7 deadly sins according to *the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)*. Greed is also known as Avarice and it can be described as follows based on CCC.

AVARICE:(from Latin *avarus*, "greedy"; "to crave") is the inordinate love for riches. Its special malice, broadly speaking, lies in that it makes the getting and keeping of money, possessions, and the like, a purpose in itself to live for. It does not see that these things are valuable only as instruments for the conduct of a rational and harmonious life, due regard being paid of course to the special social condition in which one is placed. It is called a capital vice because through it many other sins are committed. It is more to be dreaded in that it often cloaks itself as a virtue, or insinuates itself under the pretext of making a decent provision for the future. In so far as avarice is an incentive to injustice in acquiring and retaining of wealth, it is frequently a grievous sin. In itself, however, and in so far as it implies simply an excessive desire of, or pleasure in, riches, it is commonly not a mortal sin.

The virtue to combat avarice is generosity, our willingness to generously share our gifts with others, particularly the poor. Generosity is one of the hallmarks of discipleship. When interviewed with *the Catholic News Service* on the topic of being happy, Pope Francis named 10 steps and generosity as one of the necessary virtues of being happy. I share the 10 steps below for your reflection.

- 1. "Live and let live."
- 2. "Be giving of yourself to others."
- 3. "Proceed calmly" in life.
- 4. Have "a healthy sense of leisure."
- 5. "Sundays should be holidays." Spend Sundays with family and friends.
- 6. "Create dignified jobs for young people."
- 7. "Respect and take care of nature."
- 8. "Stop being negative."
- 9. "Respect others' beliefs."
- 10. "Work for peace."


Confessions: Saturdays, 4:15-4:45 p.m. at St. Barbara Church or by
