How Much Do You Know about the Eucharist? ---The Introductory Rites

As we begin a new liturgical year on this first Sunday of Advent and as we continue to celebrate the Year of Parish Eucharistic Revival (June 11, 2023---July 17, 2024), it is a good time to educate ourselves on the meaning behind our liturgy. The priest is not the only participant; rather, the congregation has an active role to play in the celebration of our Lord's life, death and resurrection. During the Mass, Christ is present in the Minister, Word, Eucharist, and the Congregation. Every gesture, saying, and symbol has deep significance that calls to mind Scripture and Church Tradition. The more we understand this, the more meaningful the service will become.

Our Sunday celebration begins with our preparation at home. We need give ourselves enough time to dress properly and to ensure our minds and hearts are ready to come together in communion as a community in a spirit of friendliness and hospitality and to dispose ourselves properly to listen to the Word of God and to celebrate the Eucharist worthily.



Mass begins with the Introductory Rites which help prepare our minds and hearts to receive Christ both in Word and Body. We gather as community and cleanse our spirits to better receive the gift.

First, we have the Entrance. We come as diverse individuals, with our busy lives and preoccupied minds, but join in song together to celebrate the coming of the Lord to this place. It is important to raise our voices as the unified Body of Christ. Father processes and bows at the altar, showing reverence for the sacred space and the Eucharist stored in the tabernacle. We then begin with the sign of cross and exchange the affirmation: "The Lord be with you. And with your spirit." In doing so, we acknowledge Christ's presence, both in the priest and the congregation.

Next we pray the Act of Penitence and Kyrie. It is when we pray a general confession and acknowledge our faults and sins in our lives. While it does not replace the Sacrament of Reconciliation, it helps cleanse our spirits. Immediately following the confession, we pray the "Kyrie" or "Lord have mercy." We recognize God's abundant mercy, and call upon Him to bestow it to us once again. In doing so, we move beyond our sins and restore our communion with God.

We further this communion with a prayer of thanksgiving: The Gloria, a prayer from Luke 2:14 originally prayed by the angels in praise and thanksgiving for the birth of the Lord Jesus. It is sung or said on Sundays outside Advent and Lent, and also on Solemnities and Feasts, and at particular celebrations of a solemn character. It is a very ancient and venerable hymn, in which the Church gathered together in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb.

The priest finishes the introductory rites with the "collect" prayer. He prays specifically on the theme of the day, based on the readings or the feast day. It is a prayer gathers together the intentions of the faithful. It is usually addressed to God the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit by the Priest, in the name of the entire holy people and of all present. All make this prayer their own by acclaiming *Amen*. We are now tuned in to hear God's Word.

Next Sunday I will share with you the Liturgy of the Word.


The Triptych of Love: Reflections on the Infancy Narratives



Weddings: Weddings need to be scheduled at least six months in advance. Couples are reminded to secure the Church date before the reception hall.




