Lenten Regulations (from March 2nd, 2022, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Radical Discipleship By Thomas Howard

Have you reflected on the blessings of the pandemic? I did, after Mass and over coffee with a few parish members. Armando, who leads parish construction projects, responded with insights that I found analogous with current challenges in my own spiritual life." Before installing a new floor, a critical first step is to get down to the core. New tile on top of old carpet is much easier and less costly, but in the long run, not a good idea. Despite the extra effort and cost, I had to remove the ugly brown carpet."

Just as Armando renewed our liturgical space with practical knowledge and common sense during the pandemic, I also initiated my effort toward personal renewal. The following helpful questions helped me get to my core: How might God be calling me to radicalize discipleship? What qualities do missionary disciples need to develop for the post-pandemic Church? Are there specific sacrifices that I must make to foster my growth as a missionary disciple? Please note that my use of the term *radical* here denotes "root." The apostles were the Church's first radical disciples. They need not be the last.

While my future remains uncertain and ambiguous, my faith in God is certain and firm.

I will no longer teach in the school. Nevertheless, I plan to make myself available to ministry and school leaders. Another change will be with whom I attend Mass. You may have noticed that it's pretty rare when my wife accompanies me to Sunday Mass. My parish responsibilities, coupled with Libia attending Mass at our home parish, made it a challenge for us to be together on Sundays these past ten years. After July 1st, this will change. We plan to be together at Mass, sometimes here in Bridgeport and Chinatown, and other times in Little Village.

I owe a debt of gratitude to two individuals. First is my wife, a relentless champion for the less fortunate. Libia graced my ministry with unconditional support,

patient listening, and practical advice. My devotion to the work here would have been impossible without her love and support. Second, to Fr. Li. I came to St. Therese with NO experience working with the Asian community. Fr. Li, consequently, took a big chance on me. Fr. Li wisely pointed me to a person, not a principle, when I hit a roadblock. Fr. Li's supervision strategy helped me develop deep friendships in both communities, thus strengthening my faith.

Speaking of gratitude, I invite you to Father's Day masses (9:30 at SBWS and 10:30 STWS) on June 19th, 2022. After the Father's Day blessings, Fr. Li will confer a special retirement blessing. I hope that you will be able to witness this blessing, but I also look forward to fellowshipping at the reception. By Father's Day, God willing, I hope to have clarity as to my next steps.
