



Our Triune God & Eucharist

"The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity."





Trinity Sunday celebrates the mystery of the Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—that Saint Paul names in today's second reading. That same Triune God is proclaimed in the Gospel's description of the saving mission of the Son, sent by the Father, in the power of the Holy Spirit. This triune God is what we believe, profess, and live by accordingly. We were baptized by God's name and we make the Sign of the Cross in God's name as we begin and end our prayers and works.

Trinity Sunday also celebrates the mystery of the Church that draws her life and her mission from the Most Holy Trinity. So, for example, the Second Vatican Council quoting Saint Cyp-

rian says: "Hence the universal Church is seen to be 'a people brought into unity from the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." (*Lumen gentium*, 4) Then, there is the extraordinary and striking description of our life in the Church in *Gaudium et spes* (*Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*): "...the Lord Jesus, when praying to the Father 'that they may all be one...even as we are one,' has opened up new horizons closed to human reason by implying that there is a certain parallel between the union existing among the divine persons and the union of the sons and daughters of God in truth and love." (*Gaudium et spes*, 24)

Last Sunday as we celebrated Pentecost, we were reminded that it's the Spirit that makes the Church alive, but it is Christ who instituted the Church. The Church is the people of God and we are many, but one Body.

The mystery of God and the mystery of the Church come together for us every time we celebrate the Eucharist. Our worship is directed to the Father through his son Jesus and in the Holy Spirit. We join ourselves to the self-sacrificing love and self-gift of Jesus offered to the Father as his supreme act of worship in the power of the Holy Spirit. That is the heart of our full, active, and conscious participation in the Mass.

If we listen and join ourselves to the words of the liturgy, we will truly know that our worship as God's very own people is directed to the Father through Jesus in the Holy Spirit. Every celebration of the Eucharist is a fresh encounter with the Holy Trinity. Listen to these words from the Third Eucharistic Prayer:

You are indeed holy, O Lord, and all you have created rightly gives you praise, for through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, by the power and working of the Holy Spirit, you give life to all things and make them holy, and you never cease to gather a people to yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to your name.

May the celebration of the Most Holy Trinity empower us to renew our love for the Church and for the Eucharist. May our merciful and gracious God bestow abundant grace upon each one of us so that we might be God's instruments of unity in our diverse world.

GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD HE GAVE US JESUS by Sr. Caritas

Today, the First Sunday of June we celebrate once again, God's great love for us. The reading begins with "God so loved the world that He sent His only begotten Son into the world, not to judge the world but to save it." We indeed are blest with the infinite love of God for us as the world of people. Jesus' presence in the world and His love for each of us, individually, is a love beyond our comprehension. We are not only shown love by His coming into the world. We are shown great love by Jesus dying on the cross for each of us. We are also shown love by His redemption of humanity. Every day of our existence, God shows us infinite love. This love is far beyond our comprehension. Any love, given to us by others is always incomprehensible. Love, being a free gift, is always more, deeper and vaster than our human minds can understand or deserve. God's love for us is more.

Our human existence, nor the gift of our life each day is something we deserve. Nothing we do or have done, make us worthy of this gift of existence and life. All is given to us out of the generosity of God. Each blessing is another sign of God's love for us. For all of these gifts we can only say thank you.

What can we do in return? One thing we can do is to ask God to help us love others with the gift of our lives. If we are open to God and ask God to help us we can allow God to love others through our love. Our care, kindness and patience with others can be the way God shows love through us to others. "They will know we are Christian by our love." We can ask God to give us His love. We can ask God to allow us to be the channel of His love through us to others. By loving others, we can allow God's love to be shown and given to others we love.

THE TRINITY'S RING OF TRUTH by Fr. Cuff

When Muslims and Christians engage in interreligious dialogue, one of the first sticking points that arises is the concept of the Holy Trinity, the mystery we Catholics celebrate today. Muslims, like Jews and Christians, believe in one all-powerful and transcendent God, whom they call Allah, and who can be said to identify with our Yahweh of the Old Testament. This is not surprising since the founder of Islam, Mohammed, was born in Arabia and raised among Jews and Christians in the late sixth century, when Christian churches in the Middle East were often mired in internal theological controversy on the nature of the Trinity, sometimes resulting in scandalous disagreements and confusion among believers.

This was the environment in which Mohammed conceived and popularized his simplified, non-Christian idea of God. He rejected what Jesus revealed of the Trinity, namely, that God is three divine persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—yet having one divine nature. Mohammed's rejection of the Trinity thus limited any scope for meaningful dialogue with Muslims concerning the concept of God, and effectively canceled out our New Testament, rejected by both Muslims and Jews. The bottom line, then, is that of all the world's monotheistic religions, it is only Christianity that believes in the Trinity; the doctrine of three Persons in one God is unique to us.

Truly the Trinity is a profound Mystery: How can God be both one and three? How can Father, Son, and Holy Spirit be fully God, while at the same time be three distinct persons? We simply cannot wrap our minds around this notion of a Triune God. However, as some Christian writers have commented, this very fact makes the doctrine of the Trinity "ring true." They say it suggests no merely human mind could have come up with the idea. It likewise suggests that God the Creator of the universe exists in a way that we mere creatures will never be able to fully grasp---and that seems to make perfect sense. They say God should exceed our ability to understand Him. If He didn't, commentators say, He wouldn't be much of a God. On today's Feast of the Trinity, let's be grateful that God, as mysterious as He is, reveals to us Who He personally is, namely, three divine Persons in one God.
