

ST. BARBARA CHURCH'S HVAC PROJECT



A Reflection by Parishioner Roberta Cheong: Planting Seeds, Part III

If we truly loved people, we would care about both their body AND their soul. God doesn't want to lose any soul to Hell, but wants every single soul saved. Jesus suffered excruciatingly and died a painful death on the cross for us. He didn't die so that people would live a life that ultimately leads to Hell. He doesn't want it all to be in vain, and He longs to be with each one of us in eternal life in the kingdom of Heaven. So let's do everything we can to evangelize those who don't know or believe in Jesus Christ or those who have not yet come into the fullest of the Christian faith that is the Catholic Church.

As Catholics, we know firsthand how incredible and lifechanging it is to be in a relationship with Jesus. Don't we want everyone in the world to have that too? A priest once said, "If we keep it (our Catholic faith) to ourselves, we are thieves." Catholic nun Mother Miriam, host of *Mother Miriam Live*, said to her Catholic listeners, "I am the richest person in the world. We have what the whole world needs. We have the truth... Beloved, no one has what we have. No one has. It is the fulfillment of Judaism, the full measure of Christianity. God help us if we keep it to ourselves. This is wonderful, but we need to give it away, and we can't be shy... There's no time. Get your children out of school, teach them the faith, live the faith, and don't pass anyone in the world without telling them that God loves them and died for them."

There is so much evil in the world, because people don't have God in their hearts, and they don't consider His feelings. Do you remember that God has feelings too? He mourned when John the Baptist died, cried when Lazarus died, and was angry at the money-changers at the temple. It hurts His heart when people hurt us, because He loves us, and it hurts Him when people offend Him. Yet, He is always eager to pour out His ocean of mercy upon us when we repent and ask Him for forgiveness. How devastated and heartbroken God must feel when after all He has done for us so that He can be with us in Heaven, a soul He loves immensely refuses His mercy and chooses to go to Hell for eternity rather than to be with Him. No one was created for Hell. We were all made to spend eternal life with God in Heaven. Let's try to keep God's heart and His feelings in our hearts the way that God holds each of us dearly within *His* heart.

If we want the world to be a better place, then sinners need to be converted. The world will change when people change for the better as a result of having Jesus in their lives. When more people love God and live in such a way that is pleasing to Him—following His commandments, pursuing a holy life, doing His will, and trying to be saints—the world will be completely transformed.

I've learned from living in a nursing home that the friends I make here can leave or die suddenly without warning. After this happened with multiple people I had been evangelizing here, I learned one of my most important lessons about evangelization: I need to evangelize like this is the last time I'm going to see this person. Yes, with that kind of urgency. It doesn't mean that I unload everything I've ever learned about Catholicism onto them in one conversation. It's quite the opposite, actually. It just means that I am fully present to them and give them all of my attention to listen deeply to what they are saying and feeling while being in tune with the Holy Spirit. I ask questions to learn more about them, because I genuinely want to know them, and I'm interested in hearing about their life and their thoughts.

It also means that if the Holy Spirit is prompting me to say something or give them something, I do it immediately. I don't wait until the next time I see them to say it, because I don't know if there will be a "next time." Evangelization is a collaboration with the Holy Spirit. When I'm evangelizing, my heart is continuously asking God, "What do you want me to say to them, to ask them? How can I bring them closer to you? What do they need to hear in order to be saved, to be sanctified? What can I give them or show them to help them know you better?"

One of the greatest lies the devil tries to make us believe is that we have time—time later on to think about God, to talk to God, to return to God, time later on to change our ways, to turn from sin, to go to Confession, to get baptized, to get our children baptized, to read the Bible, time later on to talk to that friend we've been meaning to invite back to the Catholic Church, etc. Many of us put off things we know we should be doing, but sometimes we end up not getting the chance to do it later. Confession is one of those things that should never be put off. The more sins accumulate in our soul, the more normal sin becomes to us, the less the Holy Spirit dwells in us, and the greater the distance that grows between God and us.

The fact is, our time on Earth is just a blink of an eye compared to our eternal life. We don't have that much time on Earth to evangelize and whatever we need to do to make amends with God or to do God's will, we need to do it now. We don't know how much time we have, and we don't know how much time others have. We are all merely sojourners on Earth on God's perfect time. It is not an accident that we are alive at this time in history. We were born for such a time as this and called to make disciples of all nations, so that every soul will know God, love God, worship God, and serve God.

Please contact parish office for any of the following: **Baptisms:** Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.


