Annual Catholic Appeal: Announcement Weekend

Next week is Commitment Sunday for the 2023 Annual Catholic Appeal. The theme is inspired by Pope Francis' call to the entire Church to become "synodal," that is, to journey together with the Lord prompted by the Holy Spirit. The theme is *Walking on the road with Jesus*.

If the isolation and sense of vulnerability of the pandemic has taught us anything, it is that we need to walk with the Lord, and we need to walk together in mutually supportive ways.

When Jesus says in today's selection from the Sermon on the Mount, "You are the light of the world." He tells us, in effect, that as we make our life journey together, we reflect him who is foremost and forever the light. But how exactly do we reflect his light? At the end of the gospel passage, he says that is through our "good deeds." These are the very things that the prophet Isaiah speaks of in today's first reading. Our light shall break forth like the dawn, when we share bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and homeless, and when we clothe the naked.

To walk on the road with Jesus, the light, means sharing our resources and supporting those in need. The Annual Catholic Appeal offers us the opportunity to do exactly that.

We are called to offer our financial support, our prayerful support, and our direct involvement in the Church's outreach. Through the Appeal, we can support parishes in need, Catholic schools, programs of religious education, and Archdiocesan initiatives, for example, that foster respect for life, that seek to make peace and prevent violence, and that train leaders for our faith communities.

Many families in our parish have already received the Annual Catholic Appeal mailing from Cardinal Cupich. Across the next week, reflect, pray, and ask yourself how you can walk on the road with Jesus and support your sisters and brothers who make the journey with you. Consider as concretely and specifically as you can how your contribution of time, talent, and treasure will help you to do this. Prepare to make a commitment next week during mass. When we financially support the work of our parish, our archdiocese and the Catholic Church throughout the world, we experience a feeling of deep gratitude, especially when we contemplate God's many gifts to us personally. Light In Darkness by Sr. Caritas

As some of you may know, I ministered, for a couple of years with the Native American people, a tribe on an Arizona reservation in the Sonoran Desert. Most of the land was desert and areas of the reservation were surrounded by mountains, had no large buildings. Some of the land had Adobe brick homes, one or two rooms with the cooking area outside as they cook over outdoor firepits. Some homes had electricity, but many did not. When I left more homes had electricity.

The Gospel today talks about the light shining in the darkness. If you drive in the country at night, especially in a farming area, or as I did on the reservation, there were few or no streetlights. If you were on the road away from villages, the night was very dark. We would drive and drive and the light in the homes seemed no closer. Jesus told his disciples and tells us, that they and we are that light shining in the darkness. By our actions we are light. "Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."

In this, and many other places in the Gospel and teachings of Jesus, we are called to be people of virtue. We are called to cultivate the virtues of Jesus in our lives. Jesus surely was "the light of the world." By following His example and imitating His virtues, we bring goodness and light to the places we go and live. We are to be light in our families and among our friends. Our goodness is what we bring to encourage and enlighten those around us. Be the light, lighting up the homes, places, and lives of people around us. Take courage. You are "the light of the world, like Jesus."


Please contact parish office for any of the following: **Baptisms:** Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
