Come Holy Spirit by Sister Caritas

Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. It was a Jewish feast and that is one reason peoples from all over the area, speaking various languages, were there at the time. For Catholic Christians, it is a very big feast. It is the day the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles. It is also known as the birthday of the Church. It is the first day Peter preached the name of Jesus. It is the day 2000 people were baptized Christians.

So, who is the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity. In the sign of the Cross, we say "In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". We are given the gifts of the Holy Spirit when we are baptized. When we receive Confirmation these gifts are increased and activated in us. How do we know the Spirit? The work of the Spirit is to make us HOLY. The Spirit acts in us and through us. Every good deed, every kind action is the Spirit acting in us. Every time we turn from the bad and act good it is the Holy Spirit encouraging us. *The Gifts of the Holy Spirt are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord*. These gifts are ours. They are activated in us by the action of the Holy Spirit. How does it happen that we know what to say when someone asks our advice and we have not thought about it before? It can be the action of the Spirit in us when we answer.

St. Paul tells us of the way we will know we have the Sprit. It known as the Fruits of the Holy Spirit. "In contrast, the fruits of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control". These are visible signs of actions, living in the Sprit. Are these gifts active in you? May the Gifts of

the Holy Spirit and the fruits of the Spirit be in you, around you, and with you. *"Come Holy Spirit."*

BABEL AND PENTECOST COMPARED by Fr. Cuff

The Biblical accounts of the Tower of Babel and Pentecost both treat communication through language. When human beings rely on their own efforts in their dealings with God, what inevitably follows is disaster. In Gen 11, humans tried to build a tower that would reach to heaven in order to gain access to God, and thus be able to manipulate Him. But their attempt is aborted when God confounds their language, thus preventing communication among them. The result is a proliferation of languages leading to human misunderstanding between peoples. Pentecost, however, is a reversal of the confusion of Babel. Three points are worth noting:

Firstly, at Babel, humans try to build a tower to God by their own efforts; at Pentecost God builds a bridge to humans by sending the Holy Spirit. Babel was a human initiative, Pentecost a divine initiative. Before ascending, Jesus left His disciples an impossible task to spread the Good News to the ends of the earth. But how might these twelve unlettered fishermen from Galilee go out and address the learned world of Greek philosophers and Roman poets? Even their fellow Jews are hostile to them. So, what do they do? At Jesus' command they go in to pray and wait for God's initiative. Once the Holy Spirit descends upon them, off they go into the streets to boldly and fearlessly proclaim the Good News.

Secondly, Babel brings about the disunity of humankind into different languages and nationalities. Pentecost, on the other hand, brings all peoples together and reunifies them into one "catholic" or "universal" family, embracing all races and nationalities. Pentecost then is the birthday of the Church, the Family of God.

Thirdly, while Babel is a monument to misunderstanding, Pentecost is a chorus of mutual understanding. At Babel, people came together, at first being able to communicate with a common language, but after God's intervention they become disunified, no longer understanding one another. At Pentecost, on the other hand, people of different ethnic backgrounds (Persians, Asians, Romans, Egyptians, Libyans, Arabs, etc.) hear Peter and the others speaking to them in their respective languages: "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? How is it that we hear them, each of us in our own language?"

The miracle of Pentecost is the restoration of mutual understanding, that precious gift humanity lost at Babel. Now, someone one may ask, is there such a language that one could speak and everybody could understand in their own mother tongue? The answer is yes. And the name of that language is LOVE. Love is the language that all women and men understand, irrespective of their ethnic backgrounds. Everybody understands when you smile, as St. Mother Teresa showed. Love is the language of the children of God, the only language we shall speak in heaven. If we, as Christ's disciples, learn to speak the language of love, God will not be found wanting. At the opportune time He will send the flame of the Holy Spirit to invigorate us, to change us from lukewarm to zealous, fervent, believers. Today is a great day to ask the Spirit to enkindle in us the fire of God's love.


