

Fr. Tony Gittins was born in Manchester, England and was ordained in 1967. He has M.A.s in Theoretical Linguistics and Social Anthropology and a Ph.D. in Social Anthropology. He has taught Theology & Anthropology at the Theological Union in Chicago since 1984. From 1999 to 2008, he held the Bishop Ford Chair of Mission Theology. He is currently Professor of Theology and Culture. Fr. Gittins is the author of 18 books on theological and anthropological topics, as well as on mission and spirituality.

Fr. Gittins's ministry focuses on the intersection of social sciences and theological disciplines. He works with and among marginalized communities and has done missionary and anthropological work in many countries, including in Africa.

LISTEN TO HIM—Sr. Caritas

In each of our lives there may be times when we meet very powerful and unique experiences. We may have a particular understand about who a person is and someday an event, a conversation or an experience can change how we see the situation, person, or event. We understand in a new and clearer way. It changes our viewpoint and understanding.

In today's Gospel, we have the story of the Transfiguration. Jesus takes some of the apostles whom He had chosen, up a mountain. They are not there very long, and Peter tells Jesus how good it is to be there together. A cloud comes and overshadows them. They hear a voice, "This is your beloved son, listen to Him." Between what they see and what they hear, they are overwhelmed. They fall on their faces and after a short time they look up and they see only Jesus. They are told by Jesus, as they go down the mountain not to tell anyone until "I am raised from the dead." All this they hold close to their hearts pondering and trying over and over to understand what the experience means. What now do they know about Jesus. How can they live out the meaning of this experience. Certainly, they never forgot it.

This is a story which can be read over and over and pondered throughout our entire lives. For me, each time I reflect on the words of the story, I grow a littler further in wonder and awe and hopefully experience what it means and how it affects my life- understanding what it means to be a follower of Jesus. Most of all we are called as the Father, the voice says, "Listen to Him. Listen to the story and listen to the words that tell the story.



The Archdiocese of Chicago is at a pivotal moment of structural and spiritual renewal, and that is a cause for great hope. We take up this effort at a moment in which the United States bishops have launched a Eucharistic Revival. This convergence reminds us that true renewal of the Church always involves recovering the importance of the Eucharistic celebration as the source and summit of our life as Catholics. From the Eucharistic celebration flows all the Church's prayer, activities and ministries. Pope Francis recently wrote that "the Christian faith is either an encounter with Him alive or it does not exist."

THE TREASURE OF THE TRANSFIGURATION by Fr. Cuff

A rich man died and left a large and beautiful house to a poor struggling order of nuns as a gift. The house contained beautiful paintings. Mother Superior decided to have some of them cleaned thinking they were just ordinary paintings. A cleaning company offered to buy some of them for a generous amount of money. Mother consulted an expert and to her great surprise was informed that two of the paintings were masterpieces worth millions. The nuns were overjoyed; they'd not realized the great treasure they possessed. Their experience echoes the Transfiguration.

Notice what happens just before Jesus is transfigured before his Apostles. He's on his final journey to Jerusalem, and he's just told them he is going to die, brutally, at the hands of their religious leaders. They are crushed and confused and feeling mightily betrayed. Suddenly their lives and the last three years with him seem like a huge waste. Jesus understands this, so he takes them up the mountain and renews their hearts and hopes by showing them where he's really headed, and that is the resurrection, and they realize this is their destiny too. So together they walk down the mountain, wonderfully strengthened and encouraged, to renew their journey to Jerusalem and the wonderful destiny that ultimately awaits them.

The story of the nuns fits in with the Transfiguration. Like them, we at times don't always realize the great treasure we have in Jesus. Through the Transfiguration Jesus wishes us to know him better, just like he wanted his Apostles to know that he was not only a man but also God, by changing his appearance, his clothes becoming dazzling white, and the voice of God the Father saying, "This is my beloved son, listen to him." Just as the nuns were amazed to realize the value of the paintings, so too were the three Apostles to learn that Jesus was not only a man but is also God, and they suddenly realized the importance of accompanying Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. So let us continue our own Lenten journey with Christ. Remember, Jesus is our treasure.


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.

Lenten Regulations (from Feb. 22nd, 2023, Ash Wednesday--- the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.
