We were pleasantly surprised to have **Bishop Alberto Rojas** visiting our parish and presiding at the 10:30am mass last Sunday. Bishop Rojas used to be our vicar and now he is the Bishop of the Diocese of San Bernadino.

This week we welcome **Fr. Augustine Tsang** visiting our parish. Fr. Augustine will be offering a Mandarin Retreat to our parishioners on Saturday, Aug. 6<sup>th</sup> and a Cantonese Retreat on Sunday, Aug. 7<sup>th</sup>. Father is an author of many books and one of them is focused on the Spirituality of St. Therese of the Little Flower and Today's Evangelization, which is also the theme for the retreats.

This Sunday we also have a Thank You gathering after the 6am mass in the Senior Mobile for **Fr. Michael Njeru**, who has been assisting our 6am Sunday mass in the last few years. We thank Fr. Michael and wish him well in his new ministry. We welcome **Fr. Lenard** as our 6am assistant. When you see him, please extend our warm hospitality.

Next Sunday, Aug. 14th, we have our annual **St. Rocco Feast**. Our regular 8am and 10:30am masses will be combined to a 9am mass at St. Therese Church. St. Rocco feast mass is at 10:30am.

On Monday, Aug. 15<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate **the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. Since it falls on a Monday, it is not a Holy Day of obligation this year, but it is still a holy day in honor of Mary. Our masses are at 8am at St. Therese and 7pm at St. Barbara.

#### **FURTHER EVIDENCE FOR PURGATORY by Fr. Cuff**

An unskilled worker went for a job interview and requested a salary higher than that demanded by skilled workers; the job interviewer was surprised. When asked why he demanded more he explained that since he was new to the job he'd have to put in more effort and time than a skilled worker would to do the same job, so he should be paid more. In one way, this unique way of reasoning makes sense; it's logical that an employee should be rewarded according to his service and performance on the job. This principle can be seen in the two parables about the "Watchful Servants" and the 'Unfaithful Servants" in today's Gospel with their theme of how to prepare for the coming of the Lord. Jesus encourages us to be vigilant as we wait for the return of the Master. When he returns, the faithful servant is duly rewarded and receives a promotion, while the unfaithful one is "beaten severely" and given a place with the unbelievers.

Jesus then goes on to elaborate on this notion of punishment: "That slave who knew what his master wanted but did not prepare himself or do what was wanted, will receive a severe beating. But the one who did not know and did what deserved a beating will receive a light beating." But what does this curious detail of a "light beating" refer to?

We're all familiar with the two groups into which we will be separated on judgment day: the sheep on the right and the goats on the left, the blessed and the accursed, the faithful and the unfaithful. But what is this extra teaching that Jesus gives here on those who will receive "a light beating?" Who are these servants? Surely not the blessed in heaven for they receive no beating at all; and surely not the accursed in hell, for they receive a severe beating. This passage leads one to conclude that beside heaven and hell, there is an in-between state of proportional punishment; Catholic teaching calls it purgatory, a state of temporary, remedial punishment for believers who die in venial sin. They cannot be admitted to heaven directly because they have real guilt, and yet they cannot be consigned to everlasting punishment in hell because their sin is not mortal.

Protestants often object to the whole concept of purgatory; but this Catholic doctrine does make sense, especially with respect to Christ's mention of a "light beating," which provides a third alternative to outright blessing and outright condemnation. The doctrine of purgatory satisfies God's mercy as well as God's justice. It is good news to all of us who struggle but often never quite seem to make it to these Christian ideals of preparedness and faithfulness that all we aim at. Again, it is comforting for us to know that even if we are less than faithful servants and we die in a state of imperfection, yes, that we may indeed receive "a light beating" in purgatory, but with the assurance that we'll eventually be admitted into the eternal happiness of heaven.

#### **FAITHFUL SERVANTS by Sr. Caritas**

Each of us has had the experience of waiting, in eager anticipation, for someone to come or for something to happen. The eager anticipation of little children

waiting for Christmas is one we all have done and have experienced. Children ask frequently, almost daily, "is it Christmas yet?" In each situation we need patience and persistence to continue the wait.

In the Gospel today we hear Jesus talking about the faithful servant who does his job even if the master is not there. That servant does the assigned task faithfully and the master comes unexpectedly. He finds the servant still being faithful. Jesus says that faithful servant will be rewarded.

This Gospel challenges us in our everyday life. We are to be faithful in keeping the commandments, loving one another, and following in the footsteps of Jesus, imitating His teaching and living out our lives in the pattern of life given us by Jesus especially in how we love one another. It may be easy to do this sometimes, but the challenge of this Gospel is the faithful following of Jesus always and in all the ways our daily lives give us opportunities to "act like Jesus." This is the call to us as Catholic Christians. Will you take on this challenge of fidelity?


