HVAC at St. Barbara Church

I am happy to share with you that we are going to install an air conditioning system at our St. Barbara Worship Site, hopefully completed by sometime in July. In consultation with our PPC, the Finance Council and a few parish leaders at



large, after working with experts and looking at different options, we believe the system we chose is a great investment to our historic and beautiful Church. This new system will be able to provide heat as well. Currently, for heating, our church shares the use of a set of very old boilers with our school. These boilers are extremely inefficient and close to the end of their useful life. Eliminating the burden to heat the church will give some relief to the old boilers, which we hope to replace entirely at some point in time for our school, too.

This new HVAC system for the St. Barbara worship site is an exciting project, but also requires significant amount of funding. We know that this investment will benefit our Church for many, many years to come. It will definitely make our worship and celebrations of weddings, baptisms, and funeral masses in the hot summer much more comfortable. Our Finance Council has started the conversation of having a major fundraiser for this project. I hope you will support this renovation. As we continue to work out the details for funding, I hope to have more to share with you in the next week or so.

Life is such.

ONENESS By Sr. Caritas Some of my earliest memories of my father were of waiting for him to come home from work at the corner of Clifton and Montrose. We would wait for him to get off the bus and cross the street. I would run into his arms and bury my face in his shirt which smelled like ink. He worked as a photo engraver. We would then take his hand and walk home. It always seemed very long waiting for his arrival. Being the oldest and the daughter, I was "Daddy's Girl"! I loved him very much. His heart condition grew worse, and he died when I was in fifth grade.

Throughout the Gospel stories, we are told many stories when Jesus talked about "doing the will of His Father." He was always seeking to please His Father. At His baptism, the Father's voice is heard saying how pleased He was in His Son. The disciples are told to "Listen to Him." Today's Gospel tells us that His relationship with His Father was so close, they were one, so united that they could always love completely. If we want to be like Jesus, we are to follow His example of always trying to do what The Father wants. We can be sure Jesus will help us on our journey to more complete holiness. Jesus is "The Way" to the Father. He knows His Father and knows the way to oneness with The Father. Jesus tells us, "Ask and you shall receive." Ask for the graces you need to draw closer to the Father. Ask Jesus to help you. Jesus said, "The Father and I are one." This is what we need to seek.
