Vicariate Restructure

With Renew My Church, the numbers of the parishes in our Archdiocese reduced from 344 to about 220. This change compelled the Archdiocese



to restructure our Vicariates. Our Archdiocese still has six Vicariates, but many parishes were moved to a different Vicariate based on geography and mission needs. Our parish was moved from Vicariate III to VI, effective July 1st. So now Bishop Joseph Perry is the Auxiliary Bishop for our Vicariate. Bishop Perry has visited our parish many times in the past for talks, masses, and New Year celebrations. We are looking forward to working more closely with Bishop Perry and his team.

The following neighboring parishes have also been moved to Vicariate VI:

Blessed Sacrament \cdot St. Jerome (Croatian) \cdot Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel \cdot St. Mary of Perpetual Help, All Saints and St. Anthony \cdot Old St. Mary's

Update on Facility Repairs

Part of being responsible steward is to do the best we can to maintain our facilities. With the new parish, we have a lot of buildings to care for. Due to our limited resources, we have absolutely taken our responsibilities seriously in maintaining and expanding our ministries as well as repairing and updating our facilities. Beside the new HVAC system we just completed at St. Barbara Church, the following repairs have either finished or in the plans to complete in the very near future.

- 1. We refurnished our Gym floor, replaced the broken and bad wood, sanded and repainted the entire floor.
- 2. We fixed the catch basin and the sewer line going out from the northeast corner of St. Barbara Church to the city street.
- 3. We have the fences around St. Barbara Rectory and Parish Center power washed, cleaned and repainted.
- 4. We will fix up the broken cements both from the steps and ramp in front of St. Barbara Church.
- 5. We will tuck-point the wall above the newly named St. Mother Teresa Hall.

I thank you for your generous support to our parish and I will continue to do my best as your shepherd. With your continued participation and active involvement with your time, talent, treasure and testimony, our parish will continue to grow in ministries, numbers and holiness. Trusting in God's grace and goodness, together we can be faithful servants we are called to be and the good stewards we are entrusted with. Together we can make the RMC vision a reality in our parish: make disciples, build communities, and inspire witness.

Our Prayer – For families considering adoption: May the Lord guide and bless their journeys and grant them peace along the way; *We pray to the Lord*:

TESTED BY GOD by Roberta Cheong

Every morning I offer up my life and all of my prayers, works, joys, and sufferings of that day to God for the conversion and salvation of all souls on Earth and in Purgatory, and with my heart pray "The Morning Offering" prayer. Then I pray it throughout the day whenever I am experiencing suffering.

In June 2023, I was hospitalized (again), had 3 surgeries, and had a series of tests done-CT scans, ultrasounds, x-rays, and blood tests every morning at4am.

For the two surgeries in my superior vena cava (the vein that goes to the heart), the surgeon said to me, "You will get local anesthesia in your left chest and as much pain medication as we can give you, but it will still be extremely painful.



You won't be sedated. Do you want to do it?" I thought to myself, "I've had 27 surgeries already (in the past 9 years) and endured much suffering, I know that I have a high tolerance for pain. I'll just offer up the pain to God." Then I told him, "Let's do it!" and headed off to be prepped by the surgeon's team.

The team warned me that I would feel extreme pain, that I would be completely awake and alert during the entire procedure, able to communicate at any time, and that I would need to be completely still (no moving or scratching). I asked my surgeon one final question: "If the pain gets absolutely unbearable in the middle of surgery, can I say 'Stop' and we would stop?" He said, "Yes, we will stop if it gets unbearable."

As the surgeries began, I thought to myself, "What should I pray for? Should I ask Jesus to carry my cross and bear my pain for me so that I don't have to feel any pain? No, He's suffered enough for me. I want to carry my cross, and I'm willing to suffer for the conversion and salvation of souls." So I prayed, "Please God, accept my offering of suffering." Then I braced myself to unite the pain I was about to experience to Jesus' suffering during His scourging and crucifixion.

I decided to focus my mind on prayer the rest of the time, so I prayed the rosary. The surgeon's assistants kept asking me during surgery, "How are you doing?" Each time, I replied, "I'm totally fine!" Before I knew it, 45 minutes had passed and the two surgeries were completed without me feeling any pain at all! I couldn't believe it.

4 days later, I had the surgery in my dialysis fistula. It was a very similar procedure. I was told the same thing—local anesthesia (this time in the upper arm), pain meds, awake and alert, extreme pain, etc. I was ready to offer up all my pain to God. But again, I didn't feel any pain at all and the surgery was suddenly completed.

I was awestruck at how good God was to me and how much grace He had given me. Maybe God was using these 3 surgeries to test me to see how willing I was to accept and carry whatever cross He gives me, no matter how much suffering or pain it would entail. I know that this is something God does, because He did it to test Abraham by telling him to sacrifice his son Isaac (Genesis 22:1-19). Once I proved to God that I was willing to embrace any cross from Him, He took it away and I didn't have to carry it. I passed the test.

These events made me think, "Maybe part of life is about passing every test that the Good Lord gives us—tests of faithfulness to God, tests of docility and obedience to the Holy Spirit, tests of choosing Him over being liked and accepted by the world, tests of keeping the commandments when there's a temptation to sin, tests of doing the right thing when it's hard, tests of doing the will of God when we don't want to, tests of loving and forgiving when it's difficult, tests of choosing the spirit over the flesh, tests of choosing the eternal over the temporary, tests of choosing Christ above all else, etc., much like how the 12 Apostles were tested on their fidelity to Christ on the night Jesus was betrayed. Just like in school, we need to study to pass the test. In life, we need to pray and study the Bible to pass the tests."

The next morning after surgery, I woke up unable to hear out of my left ear. I have never lost my hearing before. No one at the hospital could figure out why I lost my hearing. I did everything I could think of cleaning my ear, sticking my finger in it, sleeping on my left ear, etc. Nothing worked. Every day, I prayed desperately to God in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ to restore my hearing and heal me. I also said, "Please God, I'm a singer. I HAVE to hear." Then on the 5th day while I was having dialysis, God suddenly restored my hearing! I could hear again out of my left ear, and my heart was filled with gratitude! Thanks be to God!

THE YOKE OF CHRIST by Fr. Cuff

Once during Bible class a priest asked his college stu-Mondays with the Sisters of the Missionary of Charity: dents if they really thought that the yoke of Christ was easy and his burden light. Their answer was a resounding "No!" Asked to explain, the students recounted the many daily challenges and difficulties they faced in their attempt to be faithful to Christ's teachings. "I have this problem," said one, "I pray about it a lot and try as hard as I can, yet keep falling into the same temptation over and over again." Another spoke of trying to fight an addiction: "I've prayed about it and sought help. And I'm really trying. Yet after some successes, I'm right back where I started." Many of us can sympathize with these young people. We too have crosses to bear. In today's Gospel Jesus offers us a way out. He says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and heavy burdened, and I will give you rest." The rest He promises is a release from experiencing serving God as something burdensome. In other words He says serving God can actually be transformed into an experience of rest and refreshment, and then He shows how: "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Excuse me? Is Jesus asking us who are already carrying heavy loads to come and add a yoke to our burden? No. He's asking us to cast away our burdens and take on His yoke. That's because, unlike the burdens we bear, His yoke is easy and His burden light.

> So then, what is this yoke of Christ? Among the Jews, a voke was put on the necks of two beasts of burden so that together they could pull the plough as one. It always takes a pair to work a yoke. When Christ asks us to take on a yoke, you might well ask, "Who's my yoke-mate?" Your yoke-mate is none other than Christ Himself. The yoke, in fact, belongs to Him, and He only invites you to team up with Him. It's not just a yoke from Christ but also a yoke with Him. Thus, to take on the yoke of Christ is to associate and identify ourselves with Him: our destiny with his destiny, our vision with his vision, and our mission with His mission. It's to know that we're not pulling the yoke alone and by our power, but together with Christ and by the strength that comes from him. It's to know that Jesus is not just a teacher who gives you homework but also a friend who helps you do it. Thus we should never forget that we Christians are yoked with Christ. So let us start each day with a prayer like this: "Lord, help me to remember that there's no problem I'm going to face today, that you and I can't handle together." This is how our yoke becomes easy and our burden light. 5


