Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.

We did our best to move forward and I am proud of our collective response to the challenges of the pandemic. When I announced a general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, many parishes offered on-line Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-comprised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.

#### Heart-to-Heart with God: Part 4 By Roberta Cheong

If we take a look at the Ten Commandments, we can see that the first three commandments concern our love for God and the last seven commandments concern our love for other people. Thus, the entire Ten Commandments can be summed up when Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments" (Matthew 22:37-40).

Jesus also said, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (John 6:53-54).

"In whatever you do, remember your last days, and you will never sin" (Sirach 7:36). Even if we anticipate on living many more years on Earth, the Church's tradition of Memento Mori (Latin for "Remember that you have to die") can help us meditate on the Four Last Things (Death, Judgment, Heaven, and Hell) and help us to live with the right end in mind—the goal of Heaven.

Everyone dies, but if we believe in Jesus Christ and do the will of God by keeping His Ten Commandments, caring for the poor, doing God's will for us specifically and denying ourselves, partaking in Communion, and making disciples of all nations, then our life on Earth is just the beginning of an eternal friendship with God that continues after death.

#### THE COMING DAY OF THE LORD by Fr. Cuff

John F. Kennedy was very fond of a story about Colonel Davenport, Speaker of the Connecticut House of Representatives in 1789. One day, while the House was in session, the sky of Hartford suddenly grew increasingly dark. Some of the representatives looked out the windows and thought the end of the world had come. An uproar ensued with the representatives calling for immediate adjournment. But Speaker Davenport rose and said, "Gentlemen, either the Day of Judgment is approaching or it is not. If it is not, there is no cause for adjournment. If it is, I for one choose to be found doing my duty. Therefore, let candles be brought." Candles were brought and the session continued.

In our world today, there are two big mistakes people make about the approaching end of the world. One is to anticipate it with paranoid anxiety. The other is to dismiss it with nonchalant abandon and think no more about it. What does the Gospel say? It says that the Day of the Lord will occur suddenly and unexpectedly, unannounced, springing a surprise on an unsuspecting world. Therefore, like wise servants, we're urged to "Be watchful! Be alert!" What does that entail? It doesn't mean listening to and getting panicky over end-of-time prophecies and visions that have multiplied in our day. Rather it is, as Colonel Davenport rightly said, to be more faithful and assiduous in our duties as responsible children of God.

To be watchful and alert, therefore, means to live lives of faithful service to the Lord, following His commands and abiding in His grace till He returns. It means shunning all doomsday paranoia on the one hand and reckless complacency on the other. There is no better way for us to ready ourselves for the unexpected coming of the Lord than be found faithfully carrying out his commands in our daily life. It's futile for us to be searching for ancient calendars predicting the end of the world, since the Day of the Lord can overtake us individually any day, any time. The day we die is the day we appear before God. So why be booking passage on spaceships to Mars or stockpiling for the end of the world as some have done when we're not even sure of tomorrow? For each of us there will be an individual Day of the Lord, that day when we appear in personal judgment before God. Lastly there'll be a general Day of the Lord, the day of final judgment of all humankind. In any event, our Day of the Lord is as near to us as the day of our death, which could be any day. As we approach the season of Advent, let's resolve to be awake in the Spirit and "doing our duty" as Colonel Davenport said, by living a life of faith and love in service to the Lord, so that when He comes we'll be ready to follow Him into the glory of eternity.
