Pope Francis calls us to tell the story of Jesus with **new energy**, **ardor**, and **method** and new **expressions** of the same Gospel. New Evangelization is the way that we can **personally deepen our faith** where we can find in our hearts, **knowing more**

What is a Parish Mission?

Answer #1: A Parish Mission is a parish awakening! A time for the whole parish to come together to reflect upon God's word, to renew our faith, and to pray with open hearts and hands.

Answer #2: A parish mission is a special pastoral effort that extends over a number of days. It is an opportunity to experience spiritual rituals and sacraments in a heightened and intense way, while focusing on the major themes of the Catholic faith. The parish mission touches the heart and reminds us of God's infinite love.

Answer # 3: A Parish Mission is special time in a parish community when the community gathers together to gain further insight into a faith filled life. It is a time for grace and renewal of the parish through services and talks filled with stories, examples and meaning.

Answer #4: A Parish Mission is an opportunity to celebrate God's abundant love. The Mission is a Catholic revival. It's like an outpatient retreat. Rather than go to a spiritual renewal center or monastery, we stay at home and renew our faith through our parish faith community. The "mission" part of a Mission is that we are called not just to come ourselves, but to bring our friends and acquaintances, especially those who may have drifted from the church. "Go out to the whole world and tell the Good News." Go out to your friends, and neighbors, touch their hearts with your grace and invite them.

Why Participate in a Parish Mission?

The Great Commission of our Lord for each one of us is "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20).

By spending time in reflection, prayer, ritual and sacrament at the Mission in community with others, we might experience God's call, healing power and love anew and we might be empowered to make disciples and live out our discipleship with passion and joy.

Who is Presenting the Parish Mission?

The evening includes songs, scripture and talks presented by Fr. Tony Gittins who helps out with our weekend masses and is a well-liked and well- known speaker.

On the last night of the Mission, March 27th , our Choir will also lead a Taize prayer (music) and followed by opportunities for Reconciliation. We will have 5 priests available to hear Confessions.

Other Questions/Answers

1. How long will the talks be each night?

Mission presentations only last slightly over an hour. Most people spend more time than that watching TV each night. Make time for this special opportunity. You'll be glad you did.

2. Can I just come to one of the three nights?

YES! Just come to whichever nights you can. You don't HAVE to come to every night, but if you come Saturday, you'll want to.

3. Can I invite my family members who don't usually go to Church?

Of course! Actually, this is just the thing for them. This is a chance to reinvigorate their faith... even if they just walk away with one small nugget of inspiration, their attendance will be worth it.

I strongly encourage all of our parishioners to make time and commit yourself to at least one of the nights. Your participation at our Parish Mission might be the best Lenten gift you can give to yourself, your family and our God. See you Saturday March 25th at St. Barbara Church.

May your Lenten journey be fruitful!

The Samaritan Woman's Thirst

Thirst can be both physical or spiritual. Often it's both, as in the case of the Samaritan woman who meets Jesus by Jacob's well where they both come to get water. Physically she's thirsty for water, which brings her to the well day after day. But spiritually, she's also thirsty with an inner thirst, that evidently drives her from one man to another and for which she can find no satisfaction. Indeed, by the time she meets Jesus, she's in her sixth marriage, and when she tells Jesus, "I have no husband," she's probably already on the lookout for husband number seven.

In the Bible, in John's Gospel especially, numbers are often symbolic. Look closely at his mention of her six husbands. According to the Biblical symbolism of numbers, six is the number of imperfection, incompleteness, lack and deficiency. So this woman being in her sixth marriage, would seem to be living in a situation of lack and deficiency. Seven, on the other hand, is the number of perfection, completion, finality and sufficiency. Note that Jesus comes to this woman as the seventh man in her life. She opens up to him and finally experiences the satisfaction of everything her soul desires, the full quenching of her spiritual thirst. It's a conversion experience. Don't we all wish for the same during this season of Lent? For the first time in her life she meets a man who really understands her, and as a result she undergoes a deep conversion. Jesus has touched her heart. In her excitement she forgets her water jar and physical thirst (in fact it seems Jesus also has forgotten his own thirst) and runs back to the village inviting the villagers to come and see "a man who told me everything I have ever done." In fact, Jesus is probably the first man to know her so well without rejecting her; and before you know it, this convert herself has become a missionary, bringing others to Jesus and to the joyful experience of conversion.

Let's ask ourselves if we too have personally come to experience Jesus as the answer to our incompleteness, and decide what we'll do during the rest of Lent, including prayer and self-denial, to quench our spiritual thirst. And let's notice that today's Gospel speaks not only of water, both physical water and the water of eternal life welling up from within one's soul, but also of the need for inner conversion this Lent, and the duty we have to become missionaries to others.

Fr. Tony Gittins was born in Manchester, England and was ordained in 1967. He has M.A.s in Theoretical Linguistics and Social Anthropology and a Ph.D. in Social Anthropology. He has taught Theology & Anthropology at the Theological Union in Chicago since 1984. From 1999 to 2008, he held the Bishop Ford Chair of Mission Theology. He is currently Professor of Theology and Culture. Fr. Gittins is the author of 18 books on theological and anthropological topics, as well as on mission and spirituality.

Fr. Gittins's ministry focuses on the intersection of social sciences and theological disciplines. He works with and among marginalized communities and has done missionary and anthropological work in many countries, including in Africa.



Lenten Regulations (from Feb. 22nd, 2023, Ash Wednesday--- the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.
